Arts Expression

Back by popular demand Arts Expression Camp uses art and play to build social skills and self-esteem in children with Learning Disabilities and behaviour challenges. Participants will explore tools from drawing and sketching to three dimensional works using paint, charcoal, textiles, collage, recycled materials and much more. Still life, imagination and the works of famous artists, music and nature are used to inspire and help children translate their own personal experience into unusual and imaginative projects. Camp ends with a gallery showing of each child's work.

Music and Movement

Participants will learn to connect their minds, bodies, and senses in this interactive program. Children will participate in various activities in a safe space where they can learn social skills and work with others while building their self-awareness. Through the exploration of different instruments and movements and the use of their voice, children will learn about harmony and personal wellness. These activities are designed to teach children how to self-regulate by using movement strategies and how to read body language and connect with others.

Summer Tutoring

LDAV tutors apply a variety of approaches to support the remediation of children with diagnosed or diagnosable Learning Disabilities. These individual sessions will identify the areas of need for your child and goals related to addressing those needs will be developed. The tutor and the Educational Consultant will focus on functional skill building while increasing your child's confidence and academic success.

Early Years Literacy

Children gain the foundation needed for literacy and academic success during Elementary School and beyond with literacy and math readiness activities. LDAV instructors are specially trained Orton Gillingham teachers and Early Childhood Educators that use a hands-on curriculum. The tutor works closely with parents to help build a foundation for success and confidence in reading and writing with an emphasis on the development of the child's self esteem. The Early Literacy curriculum focus is literacy, rudimentary math readiness and is tailored to fit the needs of each child in the program.

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Leadership Education and Employment Program (LEEP)

Gain valuable work experience and skills during this eight week leadership and employment program specifically designed for youth with Learning Disabilities.

We understand that youth with unique learning styles can face challenges getting into the workforce. This program is designed to help youth explore these issues with others who experience the same battles, build their workplace skill set, and provide them with valuable and relevant work experience that will prepare them for the workforce.

Over the course of 7 weeks, youth will participate in a three day kick-off training session and six Saturday training sessions. Training sessions will build leadership skills, teach resume writing and job preparation, CPR/First Aid, and much more. Youth will also participate in four two-day work placements with different community organizations in Vancouver.

Youth will graduate from the LEEP program with a new sense of awareness of their strengths and weaknesses, new found confidence in their abilities and unique talents, and a better ability to communicate their needs. In addition, they will graduate with a range of training certificates and work experience that ready them for their first steps into the workforce.
