#### Call to Order

- E. Schneider called the meeting to order at 6:34 p.m.
- D. Johnson motioned to accept the November 10<sup>th</sup> minutes. Motion was seconded by Josie Salvail

## School Report

- S. Della Vedova and J. Giles provided an update on what is happening at the school:
  - Mr. Della Vedova reported that 1st term report cards went out this past week. No feedback was received either positive or negative, this is typical a most report card issues are resolved at the classroom level. According to Mr. DV teachers generally do a great job communicating with parents and there are few surprises come report cards. Even so, he will put out a survey requesting feedback from parents regarding reporting and the letter grade system, especially as our intermediate students will NOT receive letter grades once they move to Eagle Mountain middle.
  - Our sister school in China
    - Teachers from our district, including some from Aspenwood will be traveling to China over Spring Break to visit and teach at our Sister school.
    - Teachers will be providing 3-5 lessons a day
    - The sister school is close to Shanghai so this will be the starting point of the trip
    - S. Della Vedova is looking at creating a banner to print (silk screen likely) and take over to the school, with possibly as second one to stay at Aspenwood as a reminder or our Sister School.

- PAC was notified that our District has added 2 new Pro D Days to the schedule to provide additional time for teachers to integrate the new curriculum. These will be in February and May and have already been added to the online school calendar.
- J. Giles reported on the changes to curriculum and used a math lesson as an example
  - Article: Hard Isn't Bad was presented to start our discussion (appendix 1a)
  - Distributed Properties Math lesson was presented (Appendix 1b. In this lesson students are grouped into pairs and asked to look at a set of correct and incorrect equations, just a few at a time and to what the correct ones have in common and what the common math concept might be. This lesson focuses on cooperative work, concept attainment and independent study rather than a lecture on the concept. This lesson is then broken down into how it meets the curriculum in several ways: What is the "Big Idea"; how does it meet curricular competencies; how does it include creative thinning, critical thinking, communication, social responsibly etc. (Appendix 1c)
  - J. Giles went on to tell the PAC that this lesson is 15 years old, that old lessons are able to
    adapt to and meet the new curriculum guidelines when they are well built and teachers
    will need support and guidance in adapting their current teaching methods and resources
    to the new curriculum outlook. "Your good lessons are good for a reason, they just need to
    be adjusted to the new curriculum"
  - The additional 2 Pro D Days this year will be an opportunity for teachers to expand their toolkit in inquiry based learning and look at the new curriculum with Teacher Leaders who will be "brining home" knowledge from courses and conferences they have attended.
  - S. Della Vedova also reiterated that discovery learning is good, great even, but we won't lose the basics, to that end the school will be adding in new readers for home reading.
  - Adaptations for learning were also discussed and it was clear that adaptations should be available where appropriate for students regardless of IEP status. Such adaptations have benefits for many students not just those on Individual Education Plans. For example adaptations such as the use of Pictures for EAL (English Language Learners) can be valuable for all students.
  - Despite changes to the curriculum we will still be doing foundation skills assessment tests.
  - S. Della Vedova, "Any test is important because it is a piece of learning so we do our best. It doesn't affect your grade or report card, but we do our best none the less. "
  - Parents will still have the option to opt their children out of the Foundation Skills Assessment should they so choose.

#### Fundraising Update

- B. Anderson provided an update on fundraising activities.
  - Movie Night: November's movie night saw many new faces for setup! Thank you to everyone for their help with this event! \$750 was raised at this event with \$600 going to the bank account after all expenses.
  - Next Movie night is January 15, 2016.
  - Carnival is our next bit fundraiser being held May 27th. A committee for this will be struck in January to begin planning in earnest. The Carnival is a big fundraiser with \$15000 raised in 2014.
  - Majority of the funds raised for the carnival came from the sale of raffle tickets, we will again be asking for the support of our Aspenwood parent community to make these sales a reality.
