- 3. Message from the Chair

- Christmas Crackers for Seniors were assembled by Grade 4 and 5 students.

- Interim Report Cards have come out.
- Grade 5 hoodies have been ordered.
- Rick Glumac and council members toured the school.
- November 10th Remembrance Day Assembly

- Action: Volunteers needed to cut out 20 Christmas Tree templates for the Christmas Concert.
- We are looking into building a STEAM room. We have received a commitment from the District to build a STEAM room in collaboration with the school and PAC.
- 5. Treasurer's Report
 - Fundraising:
 - i. Hot Lunches \$6,824.63. We fundraised \$7,482.57 but we had to take into account Munchalunch Stripe Fees and 30 cent transaction fee for each order that totalled to \$657.91.
 - ii. Movie Night: after all expenses paid \$1,391.64
 - iii. Mabel's Labels for \$127.09
 - iv. Total Fundraised: \$8,343.36 (this includes Hot Lunch that has not happened yet)
 - Bank Account Info
 - v. Current Gaming Grant balance: \$16,140.10
 - vi. 2021/2022 Balance: \$9,443.55
 - vii. 2022/2023 Received: \$8,280
 - viii. Less Community Event (Welcome Back BBQ/Meet the Teachers): \$1,583.45
 - ix. Current Operating Account balance: \$45,485.92

- x. Hot Lunch Deductions still to happen: approx \$7,600
- xi. Notable Reimbursements:

- The Treasurer can provide a copy of a Profit/Loss Report and Balance Sheet in December.
- Updates of Quickbooks with real time banking information has not happened due to absence of the Treasurer.
- 6. DPAC Report
 - DPAC did a report back on the Action Plan for Learning. Aspenwood's goal is a literacy goal and SEL.

- 7. Grade 5 Leaving Committee Update
 - Gingerbread cookies have been received
 - Bath bombs have been ordered
 - Items will be for sale at the Christmas Concerts
 - Hoodies have been ordered
 - New Square machine has been purchased for the PAC, so can now take tap/swipe/chip payments at in person events. It will be stored in the safe. The treasurer approves the sign out and use of the machine, and keeps track of who has it. Users will be required to change login details each event for authentication purposes. Upon returning the machine, the user must confirm they have removed their own cell number.
