Topic of Discussion:

Surviving the BIG Behaviours and Helping Children Grow Through Them.

Adults are often thrown by typical childhood behaviour and feel at a loss on how to help children navigate their BIG emotions. Many of the BIG behaviours - including tantrums, hitting, biting, irritability, impatience, self-harming, acting mean or rude - are all rooted in frustration. Unwittingly many of the techniques we implement backfire rather than resolve the situation and may result in disconnection between parent and child. Bridgett Miller uncovers these roots and outlines steps for addressing them by sharing the developmental wisdom of Dr Gordon Neufeld, a Vancouver based clinical and developmental psychologist. Principles are applicable to children of all ages.
