Anxiety Information from the Pro-D Day

Dr. Buhr started her session by reminding us that anxiety is a normal, necessary and adaptive system. She pointed out that without some anxiety within each of us we would not survive for very long as we need anxiety to protect us from danger. Anxiety brings about our "Flight-Flight-Freeze" response and can give us an adrenaline rush. When we experience healthy anxiety there are three things that happen:

□ Psychological - body prepares to deal with the threat (increased heartbeat, faster breathing, tension)

- Cognitive focus on the threat and escape / safety
- □ Behavioural avoidance, aggression, freeze

When anxiety becomes an issue is when this system kicks into action in the absence of real danger. Dr. Buhr likened this to an overly sensitive smoke alarm. If the smoke alarm goes off all the time (whenever you cook, boil water, etc.) it can become annoying and frustrating, just like anxiety becomes when it kicks in at times it shouldn't.

Just like many things in this world she sees anxiety on a continuum, with it becoming more problematic when it increases in frequency and intensity, creates distress for the individual and/or starts to interfere with their life. Not surprisingly anxiety is the most commonly diagnosed mental health condition with an incidence of 6 - 20% in children and youth.
