Principal Report

- Thank you to the PAC for contributing to a great start up to the new school year, welcoming our Bramblewood community back
- Students are settling into the classroom, making new connections and relationships, which has been progressing very well
- Grade 4 students will be participating in the Provincial Foundational Skills
 Assessment; focusing on literacy and numeracy, which will begin in October and close mid-November; this is not on report cards
- Special experiences coming to the school/classrooms: mid-February to early March Gym Sense Gymnastics will be in the gym with their equipment and students will have an opportunity to participate / Taiko Drumming, a form of traditional Japanese, students will have an opportunity to learn about and experience
- Currently teachers are booking and organizing activities and field trips for their classrooms: Indigenous Drummer / Planetarium / Swimming. These experiences enrich our students' learning and are valuable opportunities for students.
- Terry Fox run will be held April 10th students will have an opportunity to learn more about him and his foundation and accomplishments.
- Orange Shirt Day September 29th students are learning about this in the classroom and will have an opportunity to acknowledge Canadian history by participating in wearing an orange shirt that day.
- A variety of school teams starting up for Grade 5's (Volleyball, Basketball, Track and Field) - a special thanks to teachers who make this possible by volunteering their own time to run these teams, which provide students exposure to different sports and being a part of a team.
- Volunteering: all volunteers within the school are required to undergo a police information check; additionally, for volunteers that can drive a driver's abstract

- needs to also be provided. Volunteers also need to fill out a school volunteer form.
- Interim Report Cards will be sent home on October 8th parents can expect a
 checklist to determine how students are settling in, and October 15th is early
 dismissal which allows an opportunity for parents/teachers to meet.

Construction Report

John Campbell – Principal of District Facilities and Initiatives Valerie O'Leary - Manager of Projects School District #43 JLK – Contractor

- Scope of Work: upgrading the cladding/roofing/stucco/windows/gutters/water proofing with membrane/skylights; essentially replacing the "skin" of the building from its original build in the 90's
- Schedule: work commenced July 2025 and will run into July 2026 Safety: top priority for students and staff and many measures have been implemented to ensure this:
 - -all work areas are fully closed off from students and staff
 - -fencing is secured around all scaffolding
 - -construction traffic (such as material deliveries) is only permitted during designated times (i.e. not during recess or lunch hours or shortly after dismissal)
 - -badge system- all crew should have clearly marked "JLK" badges to identify who/why they are on-site
 - -site cleanliness: designated times to ensure all material has been picked up and accounted for to mitigate injury, including using a magnet wand to ensure nails/screws are being picked up and not left out
 - -strict no interaction w/students policy
- What to expect: all stakeholders have worked very hard to mitigate any disruptions
 to the classroom; however, there will be a window replacement phase where
 certain classrooms will be displayed (approx. 2 weeks) to another classroom
 while this work is being done. Bramblewood has 2 fully functioning empty
 classrooms so it will have very little impact on the day-to-day activities of the
 classroom. Further information will be provided to each class and parents when
 appropriate.
- Communication: kindly direct any questions/concerns to the principal, Mr. Bird and from there it will passed on to our team to review/action.
