*If you mistype your password 3 times, the system will automatically lock your account. After 3 failed attempts click the blue "I forgot my password" link on the log-on screen.

- The program will ask for your email address as well as the answer to your security question.
 - o If you answer it correctly, a new temporary password will be sent to your email account.

Bring Your Own Device - Gr 4 & 5 in September 2024

REMINDER to those students going into grade 4 and 5 for September 2024, we are a BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) school. All Grade 4 & 5 students are encouraged to bring a device to school. The device will need a screen that is **10 inches and has a keyboard.** If you have a device at home that will work, we welcome you to bring it provided it meets the requirements outlined on next page.

Should you need to purchase a device, we have a few recommendations:

- We do **not** recommend Ipad Minis, the screen is too small even with a keyboard. Cellphones are not appropriate.
- We would <u>not</u> recommend Chrome Books and Android tablets (they are unable/not optimized to run some of the software we use in the classroom.)
- Think about the size and weight of the device as students will need to carry it to and from school each day.
- Battery Life we encourage you to think about devices that have longer battery life.
- You do **not** need to buy a high-end device, but you may want to think about how long you want it to last.
- Students in the district all get Office 365 for free and there is <u>no</u> need to purchase it on your own. It should be uploaded on the device prior to the start of September.

Procedures for September

Planning is well underway for next September. Our goal is to develop balanced, educationally sound classes. Every effort is made to ensure the best possible educational placement is made for all students.

On the first day of school, Tuesday, September 3rd, students will return to their last year's classroom and teacher. The main purpose of the morning is to get an accurate attendance count, so it is very important that all students attend. Students from Grade 1-5 should arrive at the start time (8:45 am) and will be dismissed after attendance is taken (approximately 9:15 am).

Students who are new to Bramblewood will report to the *Library* for attendance if they are already pre-registered and to the *Office* if they are not. Students will spend time in their last year's groupings during the first week. We hope to have our new organization in place early in the second week of September.

PLEASE NOTE that the registration for NEW Kindergarten students that morning will be at am in the gym. Today, the new Kindergarten gradual entry schedule will be emailed to families.
