### **Executive Summary**

Cape Horn Elementary School is embarking on a major renewal project to replace two outdated playgrounds with modern, inclusive, and accessible play environments. These revitalized areas will provide safe, engaging, and developmentally appropriate play spaces for over 300 students and will also benefit families and community members in the surrounding area.

**Primary funding sources will include:** - BC Ministry of Education – Playground Equipment Program - Federal infrastructure grants - Non-profit and corporate contributions (e.g., Jumpstart, BCAA Play Here) - School-led and community-based fundraising efforts

**Project Timeline Goal:** Completion of installation and safety certification by September 2026, aligning with the start of the 2026–2027 school year.

## **Project Objectives**

- Replace two outdated, non-compliant playground structures
- Construct inclusive, accessible, and safe play spaces
- Address the diverse physical, sensory, and developmental needs of K-5 students
- Enhance opportunities for outdoor learning
- Foster a sense of community pride and shared ownership

### **Scope of Work**

**Playground A - Primary Students (Kindergarten to Grade 2)** - Inclusive climbing structures with supportive design features - Sensory and musical activity panels - Adaptive swing sets and age-appropriate climbers - Poured-in-place rubberized surfacing for optimal safety and accessibility

**Playground B - Intermediate Students (Grades 3-5)** - Large climbing towers or web climbers - Monkey bars and upper-body challenge equipment - Spinner, zip line, and glider features - Log balance paths and rock mounds - Engineered wood fiber surfacing
