Therefore we ask that you consider our recommendations seriously. We in turn promise that should you offer your recommendations, they too will receive serious consideration by us. We also caution you that we have very little flexi-

bility to create changes because of several constraints such as class sizes and school organization. There is also the possibility of an unknown where we simply may not know who the teacher will be due to layoffs, retirements etc. all of these create uncertainties which make it very hard to give an accurate prediction. For each student we consider the following when placing a student in his/her class:

- social setting including friends, positive and negative
- relationships:
- academic, intellectual setting;
- male/female mix.
- child and parents relationship with the teacher;
- number of years the child has been with the teacher;
- maturity of the child;
- work habits, level of independence;
- ability and willingness to undertake a leadership role;
- intellectual growth;
- learning style factors (if we are aware)

EMERGENCY RELEASE DAY - MAY 4TH

What happens if "The Big One" happens while the children are at school?

On Wednesday May 4th, we will be conducting a district-wide Emergency Release Day.

Our school community will practice our emergency release procedures. In short, we need to pretend

that a large scale earthquake has occurred and parents (or their authorized designate) need to pick up their child from school. A release process will be used to ensure that children are handed off to the proper adult. Note that the drill ends at 2:45, which is the end of the school day and any students left behind will be dismissed in the usual way.

How it works: beginning at 2:00 pm, we will have an Earthquake Drill and evacuate to the grass field. Adults arriving to pick up their child will see Mrs. Claybo at the sign out table located at the back of the school (see posted signs).

Please contact Mrs. Claybo at the office if you have questions or require a new form to complete.

So what can you do to prepare?

1. Make sure the school has your updated contact information. Parents should have verified this information last September. Please let us know of any changes.

2. If you cannot come to the school early on May 4th, please communicate this with your emergency contact. This is a good time to review the process with your friends.

3. Make sure your child knows who the emergency contacts are so he/she can anticipate who may pick them up in an emergency.

4. Review your child's medical needs, if any. Does the school have the proper medication for your child in the event of an emergency and he/she cannot be picked up right away?

IMPORTANT EMERGENCY PREPARATION INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS & THEIR FAMILIES

What if there was a school emergency?

Your first response might be to phone the school, or, if you couldn't reach anyone at the school, just get into your car and go ... **BUT**, is that the right thing to do?

Please read the following information and talk to your son or daughter to ensure you and the student(s) in your family respond appropriately and effectively to an emergency or disaster situation at the school.

Your informed and measured response will help the school to manage the emergency effectively and will assist the student release procedures that your school has put in place.

DO'S & DON'TS

Please ...

- DO walk to the school if possible.
- If you are at home, DO ensure your home is safe to return to with your son or daughter.
- DON'T phone the school following an emergency or disaster event. Telephone lines may be needed
- for emergency communications. Check the district website (www.sd43.bc.ca) for information and updates, listen to the radio for information and updates (CKNW 980 AM, CKWX 1130 AM), or follow Twitter feed @sd43bc.
- **DON'T drive!** Streets may be littered with debris. School access routes and street entrances must remain clear for emergency vehicles.

FAMILY EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

You need to be ready to care for your family and respond effectively after an emergency or disaster, whether at home, school or work. Preparing ahead can reduce the fear, anxiety and loss that can accompany an emergency event.

Consider signing up for one of the Tri-City's free emergency preparedness workshops. You will be better able to help family and friends, and the courses are fun!

TALK TO YOUR SON OR DAUGHTER

We strongly recommend that you speak to your child about the following:

- That **their school has emergency plans** in place to ensure student safety immediately following an emergency or disaster event.
- The potential risk of **gas leaks**, **downed "live" power lines**, **debris**, **etc.** which may make streets and roads impassable and therefore not safe for your son or daughter to attempt to walk home.
- The **importance of remaining at the school** until given instructions by authorized school staff. Students will NOT be permitted to leave the school to pick up younger siblings at nearby schools.
- The **importance of the student release procedures** at the school and that you and your son or daughter need to follow the school student release procedures.



WHAT IS STUDENT RELEASE?

In the event of an earthquake or other serious emergency, the school will implement a controlled release of students for their safety and wellbeing.

Should this be necessary, the school will only release your son or daughter to **an authorized adult** as identified on your "<u>Student Identification Emergency</u> <u>Release Form</u>", or if necessary, to emergency medical personnel. Your identified alternative(s) has been authorized to pick up your child should you be unable to reach the school. Designated alternatives should live within walking distance of the school, if possible.

In the event of a serious emergency the school will respond as follows:

- The Student Identification Emergency Release Form, which is filled in by parents usually in September and kept on file, will provide the necessary information for student release.
- Students will be released from the school to an authorized adult (as listed on the Student Identification Emergency Release Form) and when it is deemed safe to do so.

Assessing the community as "safe" during a serious emergency shall be done in consultation with Emergency Responders and the School Board Emergency Operations Centre (EOC).

These School District Student Release Procedures have been developed with your child's safety as the top priority.
