Once again our school is participating in the Heart & Stroke Jump Rope for Heart event this year. This is a unique and fun program that gets kids physically active, teaches them about heart healthy choices, and provides

our school with valuable resources. The event also raises funds to support the Heart and Stroke Foundation to help to reduce the devastating effects of heart disease.

In Jump Rope for Heart, students participate in fun skipping activities on Friday, March 6th. Prior to the event, students raise pledges from sponsors and afterwards receive thank you prizes for the donations they raise individually. For safety reasons, we suggest that students do not go door-to-door. Donations will also be accepted on line at HoopsForHeart.ca. Our 'kick off' assembly will be on Friday, Feb. 27th at which time students will receive their donation envelopes.

# CAPE HORN RUNNING CLUB

Running Club will be starting soon! Running club members will be meeting every Thursday at 3:10 p.m. with the goal of improving endurance and fitness. Runners will have the opportunity to qualify for a spot on the Como Lake Relay teams, Each team will have 4 runners and each runner will run 1.2 kilometres before passing the baton to the next runner.



At the District Track Meet, students may qualify to run in the 200, 400, 800 or 1500 metres events, depending on age and ability.

As we get closer to District events we may do some runs during the lunch hour. Runners need to have sturdy, laced up shoes that fit well. Please be sure to provide your child with appropriate clothing in case of light rain. We will train in the rain, but in the case of a torrential down pour, we will cancel practice. Parents are welcome, and encouraged, to join us on any of our runs!

Later this month, our grades 1 - 5 classes will be participating in a school wide running club twice a week. Children will be working towards kilometer milestones that will be recorded on their personal certificates.

#### APPROPRIATE CLOTHING FOR THE WEATHER

At the beginning of the year we requested that students have an extra pair of "inside" shoes and an extra set of dry clothing to keep at school. We also requested that all students come dressed appropriately for the weather. Students are allowed to stay inside during a downpour, but with B.C.'s "regular liquid sunshine", we might never let students outside. If you drive your child to school, please ensure that they have warm clothes on, as they will probably be going outside for recess and lunch.

Appropriate clothing is not shorts, without long pants over them, a sweatshirt that will absorb any moisture and hold it if the student goes outside without a jacket; and it is NOT running shoes in the snow! I know that the older students do not like to wear coats, boots, carry umbrellas, or change footwear, and they are at time our worst offenders. Please help us keep them dry by ensuring they have a full complete set of dry clothes to change into.

## RECYCLE YOUR BATTERIES
