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KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

The 2016-2017 Kindergarten registration dates are February 2nd, 3rd, and 4th. Parents with children who are five years of age by December 31, 2016 may enter school in September 2016.



To register, please bring along the following documentation:

- Proof of citizenship for parent & child (one of): birth certificate;
 passport; PR Card; Canadian Citizenship Card.
- Proof of BC residency for parent (one of): rental contract; property purchase contract; income tax statement; property tax statement; and (two of): utility bill; BC driver's licence; BC vehicle registration; Canadian bank or credit card statement; BC ID.
- Proof of Guardianship: Paper birth certificate (where parents are named); income tax statement (eg: child tax credit). If parents live separately, court order or written agreement.

For Non-Residents of B.C., please contact the International Education Department at 604-936-5769.

If you are considering EARLY FRENCH IMMERSION (kindergarten entry) in September, 2016 please visit the District website at www.sd43.bc.ca for dates, times and locations of parent information meetings. Please be advised that registration for Early French Immersion will be done online from January 14-20, 2016 For more info on French Programs, please call Ms. Sophie Bergeron at 604-937-6392.

If parents want their children to be registered at another school, but reside in the Cape Horn Elementary catchment, they must first register at Cape Horn and then complete a cross-catchment transfer form beginning February 5th @ 9:00 a.m. and ending on February 17th @ 4:30 p.m. PLEASE NOTE THAT SIBLINGS OF STUDENTS IN ATTENDANCE AT CAPE HORN ARE CONSIDERED AS A CATCHMENT AREA CHILD AT THIS SCHOOL AND THEREFORE DO NOT NEED TO FILL OUT A CROSS CATCHMENT FORM. The electronic version of the application form can be accessed through the District website (www.sd43.bc.ca). Paper forms will also be available at all schools as of February 5th at 9:00 a.m. All completed forms must be returned in person or by mail to the School District Office at 550 Poirier Street, Coquitlam, V3J 6A7 by the closing date. Faxed or emailed copies will not be accepted.

We will also need phone numbers for:

- Home, work, cell, Doctor's office, personal health number, babysitting/daycare
- 2 alternates in case of emergency (every effort is made to contact parents/ quardians first)

If neighbours ask you when they should let us know that they will be coming to our school in the fall, please let them know they should do it right away. Our staffing is based on the number of students we project for September, and we can do a better job of this if people register right away. Please help spread the word - every child counts.

IN CASE YOU'RE WONDERING ABOUT GRADE 4 FSA'S ...

Who? What? When? Where? Grade 4 student provincial reading comprehension, writing, and numeracy assessment will take place this month in our grade 4 classroom. Comprehension and Numeracy components consist of multiple choice and open ended questions. The writing component consists of first drafts of two writing assignments

Why? FSA provides a "snapshot" of how well BC students are attaining foundation skills. It helps answer important questions such as:

- Are students learning vital skills they will need later?
- Are there any trends in student performance at the school, district and provincial levels?

Then What? Results will be returned to districts and schools for planning purposes next fall. Each student's individual results will be sent to schools. They will be shared with students and parents, along with other information about the student's performance.

The School Planning Council (SPC) reviews results as part of the work on our school goal planning.



PLAYING OUTSIDE

We believe it is important for children to run and play during recess and noon breaks. Providing children with outdoor play opportunities allows them to burn some pent up energy, get some fresh air and feel revitalized for learning. During the cold winter months, we are obviously very careful in making decisions about whether or not our students will go outdoors. Just prior to each break period, we check the weather in order to determine the latest information respecting temperatures and wind chill factors. However, we encourage you to dress your child appropriately for our 'wet' coast climate: mitts/gloves, boots, a warm winter coat (with a hood or a toque).




