

#### SUMMER READING

While summer is a time for adventure and having fun, it is important to include reading in that mix. The short article below reminds us of the importance of summer reading. When parents read with their children, they pass on a powerful message about the importance of literacy. As children read, they develop stronger thinking and language skills. Children who read are also strong in mathematical thinking. Lastly, practicing reading enhances positive self esteem. Have a wonderful summer and enjoy reading with your child.

#### SIX BOOKS - ONE SUMMER

Six books. That's all it takes. Studies show that when a child reads as few as six appropriately grade levelled books, he or she is likely to



fend off summer reading loss and maintain gains made during the previous school year. Not to mention the gain in adventure, new discoveries, and fun that a stack of six kid picked summer books can provide. And when a child reads even more books -8 or 10 or 20 - he or she may even gain ground, and return to school in September a more confi-

dent reader. As educators, we all want to help make this happen for children. One of our most fervent hopes and goals is that hey will learn to love reading. We want them to read for pleasure, not just to fulfill assignments, and to enjoy the school success that positive reading experiences can bring.

#### STAFFING UPDATE

As is customary, over the past few years, the District determines the number of teachers required. Teachers on temporary contracts receive layoff notices to balance the overall need within the District. Throughout the summer schools requiring additional teachers are then able to post and fill.

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






