COMO LAKE RELAYS/RUNNING CLUB



Running Club has begun! Running club members will be meeting every Friday from 3:00-3:45 pm with the goal of improving endurance and fitness. Runners will have the opportunity to qualify for a spot on the Como Lake Relay teams, Each team will have 4 runners and each runner will

run 1.2 kilometres before passing the baton to the next runner. Students that are unable to commit to attending the practices or an unable to run a kilometer without stopping, should not expect to be put on a relay team.

Runners need to have sturdy, laced up shoes that fit well. Please be sure to provide your child with appropriate clothing in case of light rain. We will train in the rain, but in the case of a torrential down pour, we will cancel practice. Parents are welcome, and encouraged, to join us on any of our runs! Later this month, our students in grades 1 to 5 will be participating in a school wide running club twice a week. Children will be working towards kilometer milestones that will be recorded on their personal certificates.

SPRING BREAK DAY CAMPS THE "SCHOOL OF WONDERSTANDING" 2016

The Professional Development Program at Simon Fraser University is excited to offer days of hands-on, action-packed activities this Spring Break from Monday, March 21^{st} through Thursday, March 24^{th} , 2016 for students from grades K-5. The four days of activities will run from 9:00 a.m. - 2:45 p.m. each day.

This unique opportunity is part of a wonderful community partnership between Simon Fraser University and School District 43. During the four days of our "School of Wonderstanding," students will participate in a number of different activities such as cooking, crafts, indoor/outdoor games, dance, sports, science experiments, drama and of course, FUN. All sessions are fully supervised by Student Teachers in the Professional Development Program, as part of their teacher training. And they will be working under the supervision of certified teachers. Each session is designed to excite and delight participants with hands-on, creative learning opportunities to strengthen the connection of "wonder" and "understanding" of the world around us.

The Maillard School of Wonderstanding camp will be facilitated by the Aboriginal stream of Simon Fraser University student teachers. This camp will incorporate traditional aboriginal cultural teachings as part of the program curriculum of this camp.

The cost for all 4 days of activities is \$60 per student, which includes supplies and materials. Participants will need to bring snacks, a bag lunch, a water bottle (with their name on it), dress comfortably and come ready to have ${\sf FUN}$.

Four Pillars of Rights

Through Rights Respecting Schools, students learn they have a responsibility to respect their own rights and those of others (based on class charters).

Be Heard

Rights	Responsibilities
Article 12 - You have the right to give your opinion, and for adults to listen and take it seriously. Article 13 - You have the right to find out things and share what you think with others, by talking, drawing, writing or in any other way unless it harms or offends other people	Respect others' right to share their views by asking what they think or want to do.

Be Safe

Rights	Responsibilities
Article 37 - No one is allowed to punish you in a cruel or harmful way.	Students are responsible for their actions and should lead by example through proper, peaceful conduct.
Article 39 - You have the right to help if you've been hurt, neglected or badly treated.	Respect others' right to protection from harm by being kind and stopping bullying.

Be Healthy

Rights	Responsibilities
Article 24 - You have the right to the best health care possible, safe water to drink, nutritious food, a clean and safe environment, and information to help you stay well.	Students are responsible for living a healthy lifestyle, ie: getting plenty of rest, eating nutritious food and getting daily exercise.

Be Yourself

Rights	Responsibilities
Article 30 - You have the right to practice your own culture, language and religion - or any you choose. Minority and indigenous groups need special protection of this right.	Students have the responsibility to learn about other cultures as the opportunities arise and to be respectful and to be respectful of differences.
