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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE:

Dogs on Cape Horn School Property

We recognize and appreciate that dogs are significant and adored members of some of our families, and caregivers take advantage of the morning and afternoon walk to school to exercise their dogs. We need to balance this with the acknowledgement that not all of our community members are comfortable with dogs. When dropping off and picking up your child, all dogs should be leashed and under the direct control of the owner. Dogs should never be off leash or tied unattended to fences or other objects. We also ask that owners be mindful not to enter the school with their dog and not to block the major entrances and exits to the school or be around the playfields/structures, as some of our students and parents are uncomfortable coming into contacts with dogs.

Concerns have also been raised about dog owners not cleaning up after their pets. We are requesting that pet owners ensure that feces and residue is not left on school grounds, especially where children play, including the fields, playground areas, etc. While it is difficult for school staff to supervise school property usage during the evenings and weekends, the City of Coquitlam, Bylaw Office has been contacted to help monitor school grounds during these times. Their phone number is 604-927-7387. The staff at Cape Horn Elementary are working hard to ensure a safe and caring school environment and with your cooperation we hope to continue to work with all of our community members.

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CAPE HORN SCHOOL STUDENT PLACEMENT PROCESS FOR THE 2016- 2017 SCHOOL YEAR



As the end of this school year approaches, we begin to make plans for September of the next school year. One of those tasks is the assigning of students to classrooms for the following year. As with past years, it is again likely that we will have some split, or

combined classes.

Criteria for Placement:

In the process of making student placements, consultation takes place with former and present teachers, the Learning Support personnel, other support personnel as required, and the principal. The principal has the responsibility for final placement of each student. This development of class lists is given a great deal of time, careful thought and understanding with the knowledge teachers have of each student and what will be in the child's best interest.

With respect to combined/split classes, please remember that combined classes are a fact of school life, and are more the norm than the exception. We are very confident that the students in these classes receive a full and rich academic program at their grade level.

We will re-assess the class organization after the fall registration period as we become aware of any enrolment changes that have taken place over the summer months. Please be aware that our September classroom assignments are tentative and that temporary classroom assignments will not be posted before the first day of school in September.

Parent input is also considered provided that it is received in writing/email to the principal, Mr. B. McGovern, before May 31st, 2016. Please note that the focus of parent letters should be about their own children and should be based on sound educational reasons. Please keep in mind that requests must be related to your child's specific learning needs and style. Only sound educational reasons will be considered at the placement meetings. Due to many placement factors and the allowable class size, we may not be able to accommodate all requests. Requests for specific teachers or suggestions regarding the placement of other children should respectfully be avoided. While we guarantee that all parent input will be given careful consideration, we cannot promise that all requests can be met.

As of today, we have 25 students registered for Kindergarten next year. If you know of any friends or neighbours who have a child turning five during the 2016 year who has not registered for Kindergarten as of yet, please remind them to do so.

It is very helpful to us in planning staffing and class organization if we are able to determine approximately what our student population will be for the fall.
