Safety Drills

Throughout the year we are required to hold fire drills, earthquake drills and code "yellow" drills with our students so that they are familiar with the routines of evacuating the building, regardless of where they are at the time of the drill. Should you ever be in the school during a drill, it is your responsibility to vacate the building as quickly and quietly as possible, meet on the soccer field and wait for instructions once outside. We are very pleased with the way in which our students conduct themselves during these drills.

Wash hands front & back for 24 seconds (singing Happy Birthday or the ABC song)


and that makes for a huge variety of

Reminder to Parents re \$40 a day

The Ministry of Finance announced the Temporary Education Support for Parents to ehlp with learning and supervision during the labour distruption. The temporary education support payment of \$40 a day will be paid from Sept. 2/14 to Sept 18/14, the day teachers ratified the agreement.

The parent or primary caregiver of eligible students 12 years old and udner attending BC public schools is eligible to receive the payment. The deadline to apply is January 31, 2015.
