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STUDENTS' SUPPORT PROGRAM AND SERVICES

Student Services At Cape Horn, the various educational needs of our children are met both within the classroom and by specialized professionals within the school, Our student sup-

port staff work as a team to provide additional service to children in many areas. These include learning assistance and resource programming, ELL, challenge or gifted programs, counseling and speech and language support. These services are provided to children with identified needs, in both in-class and pull-out programs. The following staff comprise our Student Services team:

Mrs. Kristina Dressel provides skill development instruction and support to Kindergarten to Grade 5 students, and coordinates the schedules for the EAs.

Mrs. Julie Mott provides English Language Learners (ELL) support and instruction. She provides classroom support for Learning Assistance and writes Individual Education Programs for students with identified learning difficulties.

Mrs. Tia Turner will be working with gifted learners, providing learning assistance support and teaches Music to all our students.

Ms Anya Bayley, our Speech and Language Pathologist, works with those children requiring articulation support or language development. Ms. Bayley will be at Cape Horn every Wednesday.

 $\mbox{Mr. Bill }\mbox{McGovern}$ is our school counselor and can be contacted at anytime.

Ms. Jackie Toombs is our Aboriginal Youth Worker. She will be at Cape Horn on Monday mornings and Wednesday afternoons.

Mrs. Angie Bermisa, Mrs. Charlene Dalke, Mrs. Jacqueline Dobson, Mrs. Joyce Donald, Mrs. Terri-Lynn Girond, Ms Margaux Jackson, Mrs. Monique Power and Ms Jennifer Young are the Education Assistants (EA's) who work with individual students who have special needs as well as groups of students who require support and assistance.

Please contact any of the above staff members if you have any questions regarding their programs or the support they are providing your child.

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ABSENT/TARDY



If your child is going to be absent from school or late for any reason, please remember to contact the school at 604.526.4428. An answering machine is available 24 hours a day for your convenience.

For the safety of your children, we have a Phone Home Program. If we do not know the reason why your child is absent, we will contact all emergency numbers available until we can be sure that your child is safe. Please be sure to advise the office if you have a change in any emergency contact phone numbers. We really appreciate your cooperation in helping to keep this timeconsuming (and worrisome!) process to a minimum.

WET COAST WEATHER



So what does this mean to your child? This means that all students will be going outside regardless of the weather (rain or shine). We have found that having students outside playing with their peers every school day, encourages physical activ-

ity and gets them some much needed fresh air. Exceptions may be made on very rare occasions at the discretion of the Principal when extreme weather conditions exist. As our weather is often unpredictable, please help your child select appropriate clothing for the rain. Boots, rain coats, hats and umbrellas are welcome additions to everyone's rainy day wardrobe. Younger students may like to keep a change of clothes at school. We

appreciate your support in keeping students healthy and comfortable.





STUDENT ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL DUE TO FAMILY HOLIDAYS

As a response to a growing trend that we are observing in the number of families taking vacations during prescribed school days, we have provided the following statement:

We strongly encourage families to plan vacations during scheduled vacation breaks and non-instructional days. This will provide your child with a consistent and sequential learning experience. Often parents will ask for work to take along on vacations with the thought that the work provided will keep them up with the rest of the class. Many lessons, however, are based on class oral work, hands on experiences, and group discussions. These lessons cannot be re-taught and it would be difficult to duplicate them on an individual basis. Please understand that work cannot be provided that will compensate for the time missed from school.

NO CHILD WITHOUT

Our school is involved in the Canadian MedicAlert Foundation's No Child Without program. There is no cost for students who attend our school ad are between the ages of 4 up to their 14th birthday to join MedicAlert through this program. If your child has a medical condition, allergy or is required to take medication on a regular basis, then you should consider this program. A child's MedicAlert identification can alert school staff, friends, coaches and others about your child's medical condition should an emergency occur.

HEAD LICE

Reminder, please check your child's/children's hair for head lice as it is head lice season. If you notice any of the following, please contact the office. This will be kept confidential and a standard letter will be sent out to the relevant classes informing parents of the presence of lice.

Evidence of Head Lice may be as follows:

- nits found on the hair
- · live or dead lice seen on the scalp
- · nit shells from hatched lice or dead eggs found in the hair Please remember that Head Lice is determined by the Fraser Health Authority to be a nuisance, not a health risk.
