## 5. First Day of School

## 6. Pink Shirt/Orange Shirt

- Orange Shirt were available for purchase at \$15. A Grade 9 Indigenous student from Burnaby South designed the shirt. Limited sizes left.
- Pink Shirt: Kindness Day used to be the last Wednesday of every month. October will be the first Pink Shirt week. May use district design for pink shirt this year. Old pink shirts kids have grown out of have been donated and will be displayed for parents to take.
- Kindness Assembly: A teacher used to pick a theme, sometimes a presentation, or an activity.
- Parents would like to see antibullying and diversity incorporated into Kindness theme.


## 7. Fundraisers

- Art Created by Kids: Card stock papers will be handed out at school. Kids make artwork, then Photo Express will create orders. Launch in mid Oct, and orders should arrive in December.
- Provincials Spirits: Place order online using the link, specify Cedar Drive, and 20\% of sale go to Cedar PAC. Fundraiser is going on until Dec $15^{\text {th }}$ (in time for egg nog drink).
- Lunch Lady: PAC receives a small kickback. It is scheduled for every Wednesday. (Should inquire about round up and "purchase for someone else" options)

## 8. Charity of Choice

## 9. Events

- Holiday Movie Night: Dec $2^{\text {nd }}$, bring your own chairs/sleeping bags. Grade 5 does concession; PAC takes donation at the door.
- Parent Ed: Presentation on social media awareness, digital citizenship and cyber bullying in January. There will be separate presentations for students, parents, and teachers.
- Carnival: Saturday Feb $4^{\text {th }}$. Games in the gym with silent auctions and raffle baskets. Each division should "adopt" a game and be in charge of staff their game.
- Sports Day: Parents would like to volunteer at Sports Day again
- Dance/Survivor: Event must be split. It used to be mother-son/father-daughter. It has not been decided how the events can be divided (Odd/even number grades?) These big
events need a lot of volunteers and will have to be scheduled apart to avoid volunteer burnout. Some suggested ideas are Amazing Race and scavenger hunt.
- Paint night was also proposed.


## 10. New Business

- Food insecurities are identified through observations and parent conversations. There are many new families. The school is in the process of identifying families in need. School covers school supplies for some students. Other suggested ways to help families include holiday hampers and gift cards.
- Security: The school is mindful of which doors are locked to strike a balance between being careful and being safe. In addition to fire drills, lockdown drill is done once a year.
- When planning events, can volunteer parents talk to EA regarding accommodating needs? Questions should be directed to Skill Development teacher instead.
- May alternate general meetings between in-person and virtual meeting.


## 11. Principal's Report

- Rick feels fortunate to be here with the community and is looking forward to working with parents.
- Parents can reach out to classroom teachers about classroom volunteering.
- The school currently has 279 kids. When the extra division was created, space was built in to allow open spots for new students.
