## Approval of Agenda

Approval of Agenda by Erica Salemink. Motion was passed unanimously.

## 1. Principal's Report

- Remembrance Day assembly: Great to have so many families. Big thanks to Ms. Phillips for organizing, and to all the teachers who worked with kids who presented.
- Winter Concerts (Dec $14^{\text {th }} \& 15^{\text {th }}$ ): Preparation underway. Format is likely same as past years.
- Grade 5 Volleyball team, coached by Ms. Creightney and Ms. Forsberg, played against Leigh at our gym. Will play at the Jamboree at Pinetree on Nov $24^{\text {th }}$.
- MyEd: Term 1 report card will be available for parents on MyEd Portal on Dec $15^{\text {th }}$; no printed report cards will be sent home. Dayna will send info for new MyEd accounts. Report Cards can be accessed until the end of the school year. MyEd will reset during summer break and report cards will be archived. Parents should download report cards before they are removed from MyEd.
- Student and Family Affordability Fund: Not a lot of families have come forward. Rick and the counsellor follow up when a need is discovered. (Some families have access to the Starfish Pack program, the school lunch program, and/or have received school supplies.) Staff have been consulted on SFAF. One suggestion is to take a portion of the fund and put it towards all Cedar families as every family is affected by inflation. As most classes will have at least one field trip this year, the money can be used to offset fieldtrip cost.
- Enrollment: Steady flow of families have moved into North PoCo. Many Northside schools are quite full but are working together to find space. There were some space at every grade but they are slowly filling up. Enrollment is at 286 now.
- Pink Shirt Swap: Bring outgrown pink shirts back week of Kindness day for a swap and help normalize sharing. Could tie in an Earth Day theme in April.


## 2. Treasurer's Report

- All fundraisers closed in November. Totals will be presented at next meeting.
- Grade 5 now at 58 students; PAC will commit $\$ 580$ to Grade 5 event.
- Some money came in from TruEarth.
- Spending: Carnival prizes, PAC meeting babysitting sessions, Fruit and Veggie supplies
- Grade 5 hot lunch at $\$ 2100$ but amount does not include expenses on juice, treats, and Taco del Mar payment.
- Neufeld total and Grade 5 hoodies final numbers not in yet.
- StrongStart Funding: Increase Classroom Funding budget by \$200 to include StrongStart.

Motion to increase funding by Alex Josephson. Seconded by Jane Adams. All in favour. Motion is carried.

- TruEarth: Ongoing
- Lunch Lady: Ongoing
- Provincial Spirits: Order online until Dec $16^{\text {th }}$
- Spirit Wear: 31 pieces ordered, to be delivered week before winter break.
- Art Created by Kids: 85 students ordered. PAC gets $30 \%$ of sale. Will be delivered week of Dec $9^{\text {th }}$.
- Plants: 26 orders (less than previous years). Profit of \$194
- Gift Card: Received \$38K in orders (usually about \$45K), PAC gets $\$ 2200.3$ businesses ordered large amounts: \$15K, \$11K, and \$4100. Meridian Meat gives 30\% back; next available date with Meridian is May $26^{\text {th }}$. Spring Gift Card is usually too small to justify shipping expense.
- Excel Martial Arts: Movie and Pizza Night Mar $4^{\text {th }}, 6 p m-9 p m$. Cost $\$ 20$, $\$ 16$ per child goes back to the school. Max 80 kids. Ages 5 and up.
- Designer Cookies: 6 pack of cookies. Easter or Spring theme with edible pen to customize cookies. Orders in by March $10^{\text {th }}$.
- Me n Eds: Restaurant night on Nov 17 ${ }^{\text {th }}$. School gets 20\%. (Upcoming restaurant nights: Domino's/Thurs, Jan 12, Chipotle/Wed, Feb 15, Boston Pizza/Wed, Mar 8)


## 8. Book Fair

- First in-person bookfair since COVID. Worked very well in the gym. \$5000 in sales compared to \$2-3000 at previous Book Fairs. The school kickback increases with higher sales amount. Received 60\% back (highest tier).
- Kids received prizes and one child from each division won a poster. Teachers pick out books for their classroom. Books were picked for the library. Remaining amount banked for the school to spend.
- Next Book Fair scheduled for Thursday, April 20, 3-8 pm evening before Pro-D.
