April 10th – School Wide Walking Field Trip to Birchland Elementary School

On Thursday April 10th, students and staff will be walking to Birchland Elementary School to watch a presentation by the Duffle Bag Theatre group. We will be leaving Cedar Drive shortly after 1pm and we expect to be back for dismissal time, but we may be a few minutes late.

April is Autism Acceptance Month

Autism is a neurodevelopmental condition that impacts how a person thinks, learns, and experiences the world. The term "neuro" indicates that autism affects the brain, while "developmental" signifies that it is present from birth and continues throughout a person's life, with characteristics that may evolve over time. There is no cure for autism, nor would we want one, as it represents a unique way of being human. Autism can be diagnosed in



individuals of any gender, race, ethnicity, or economic background.

Why Johnny Doesn't Flap: NT is OK! is a video story. This children's picture book is written by Clay Morton and Gail Morton and is illustrated by Alex Merry. The story is written by a neurodiverse (ASD) person from the perspective of an ASD child. The narrator is neurodiverse (ASD), and he tells the story of his friendship with Johnny, who is neurotypical. The narrator's reaction to his neurotypical (NT) friend's quirks shows readers that 'normal' is simply a matter of perspective. This story is a great way to start a conversation with your child about neurodiversity and ASD.
