

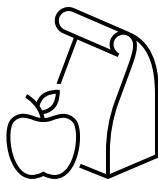

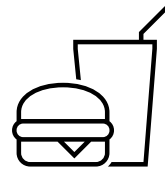
Tuesday, June 17, 2025 – Day 1

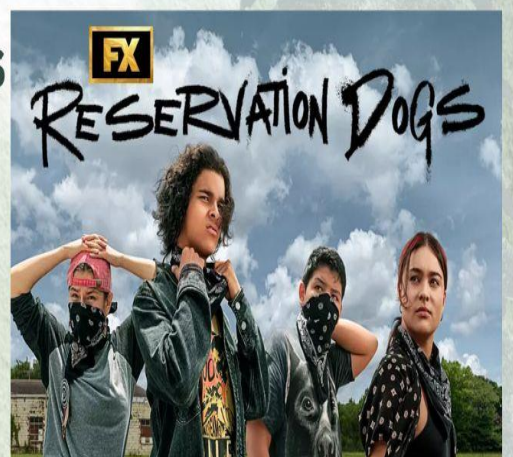
