**Graduating Centennial Student - Proceeding to post-secondary** 

- A. A complete APPLICATION via **forms** should include:
  - 1. Personal letter (up to 500 words, one page max.)
    This is all about YOU! Not a repeat of your resume.

A personal letter should make you shine. Include passions, post-secondary plans and future goals.

- Reference letter (from a coach, mentor, volunteer coordinator, teacher etc.)
   Request TWO WEEKS <u>before</u> spring break!
- 3. Resume or brag sheet
- 4. **Transcript** (from STS/optional)
- 5. Financial information question Must be completed when 'financial need' is in the criteria.
- B. Donors provide funding in three categories:
  - 1. **Scholarships** Academic achievement, Merit, Excellence
  - 2. Awards- Combinations of academic achievement, extracurricular and/or community activity
  - 3. Bursaries- Financial need/Students who will apply for Student Aid BC combined with a variety of criteria.
