

WELCOME!

Fall updates to note:

CHANGES TO UBC AND SFU FOR ADMISSION TO FALL 2026

- AT THIS TIME, EDUCATION PLANNER BC IS NOT 100% UPDATED FOR CHANGES TO SFU. Spring application window is still open. (old requirements)
- Go to the SFU website directly TO CONFIRM ADMISSION REQ'S AND THE NEW APPROVED COURSE LIST.
- APPLICATIONS OPEN OCTOBER 1ST. Students in the 90% range should apply early to be evaluated earlier (Nov-Dec)
- SFU no longer requires self reporting.
- NEW**One unified approved course list. No list A and B. More holistic approach to admission. AP courses accepted as approved course.
- NEW** **SFU-EXETER NEW ACCELERATED LAW** (6yr dual degree) program. <u>Accelerated Law</u> (SFU-Exeter) Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences Simon Fraser University
- Grade 11 science req's expanded -faculty of science. (two of chem 11, life sci 11 phys 11)
- New* Have a minimum grade of 70% or higher in 70% in a senior level English
- Medical School may open in 2026 TBD.

UBC updates

UBC no longer has an 'early admission deadline'. The deadline to apply by Dec 1 - ONLY for selected major scholarships.

- Now using first review process to assess students early. Top students can apply earlier to be assessed earlier.
- UBC Admission averages continue to increase across all faculties.
 SEE MRS HW AFTER THE MEETING FOR DETAILS.
- UBCO New BCom program (re-brand) Aligns with Sauder UBCVan.
- UBCO Bachelor of Nursing requirements changes (Chem 12 still recommended)

- Canadian Coast Guard Academy 80 seats. apps close in February
- **Douglas College** Some names have changed. Volunteer hours waived for most programs except Social Work. HCA and Mental Health & Substance Abuse programs now go thru **Douglas** application process. Apply early for Limited Entry programs.
- **TRADES** many waitlisted 2 years plus (Electrical, Hvac, Piping). Apply **EARLY** in grade 12. See Mrs. HW VCC adding Electrical as of Jan 2026.
- KPU now offers an Engineering diploma (2yr) for Transfer.
- **BCIT** Housing is now open! Apply Early for popular programs spots fill.
- UVIC Open now, no supplemental for BCom. Deadline Jan 31 most programs.
- Langara New Digital Media and Design program
- APPLY FOR ENTRANCE AWARDS IF YOU MEET CRITERIA! THEY HAVE FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR GRADS!!

Scholarship eligibility:

*Graduating students*Canadian Citizenship, PR or Landed Immigrant Status,
Protected persons/Refugees will fulfill most requirements and criteria.

**International Students do not meet this requirement.






Notable News and Events

- WHEN should I apply for scholarships?
- Start NOW for <u>Entrance</u> Scholarships and National/<u>Major</u> Awards
- Most scholarship deadlines occur within the months of February-May

SCHOLARSHIPS, BURSARIES & AWARDS - AN OVERVIEW Financial aid is not the same as Financial need

Financial Aid:

• Refers to monetary support, in general, as a loan or scholarship, that is used to pay for school, especially higher education:

"I don't qualify for need-based financial aid, so I'll apply for merit-based achievement, community service and/or leadership awards."

Financial Need:

• The difference between the <u>cost</u> of an educational program and what the student can <u>afford</u> to pay. One's **financial need** may qualify one for <u>grants</u>, <u>scholarships</u>, or low-<u>interest loans</u> and/or student aid.

Student Aid BC - Explore the website-

 Parental & student annual income is considered for students applying for Student Aid BC including both low <u>and</u> median income households. You and your parents are expected to contribute to your education costs.

2025/2026 weekly maximums

- If you do not have dependant children, you can receive up to \$520 per week of full-time study.
- Note: the above amounts reflect a temporary increase to the weekly Canada Student Loan limit, in place until July 31, 2026.

2025/26 Living Allowances for Students residing in B.C.	Monthly	Weekly
Single student away from home	\$2,423	\$563
Single student living at home	\$824	\$192

Sample Costs of Post Secondary

College:

Douglas College: First year full time Tuition can range from \$5,000 to \$13,000 per year including Fees & Books- depending on choice of program and where you live.

University:

UBC approx \$22,000 per year full load, (including living on campus (shared/meal plan) books fees and living expenses.

• Private colleges and universities and US schools have much higher tuition.

<u>Trades</u>

Foundation programs (24 weeks on average) \$2K to \$4K plus gear. Lots of funding available. Many programs are waitlisted 2yrs+.

BC Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship \$5,000

(20 awards available to students entering a <u>Faculty of Education program</u>)

BRITISH Ministry of

BC Excellence Awards \$5,000 One nominee

There are 55 BC Excellence Scholarships available to recognize well-rounded B.C. graduates. Winners will have demonstrated service and leadership, both at school and in their communities, and shown aptitude and commitment to their chosen career paths. They will receive a \$5000 scholarship voucher to use for post-secondary tuition. DUE: Feb 15th

BC Achievement Scholarships \$1,250 Automatic Students do not apply.

Recognize the top 8000 graduates in the province.

District/Authority Awards \$1250 - Apply within our local scholarship package in the spring. 35+ available for Centennial graduates.

• The application will require teacher signature which verifies that you **EXCEL in the focus area**. Must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant) and have that on record with the school at which you registered for Grade 12 Be a B.C. resident. Valid for 5 years.

Superior Achievement/Excellence in one of the following areas:

- Fine Arts (Fine and Performing Arts: Art, Music, Drama, Voice etc.)
- Applied Skills
- Trades and Technology
- Physical Activity (community and/or school-based teams and/or provincial/national level)
- Curricular Second/international Languages
- District / Curricular Technical & Trades Training
- •School & Community Service (min 100 hours to apply)

Loran Scholars Program / Major Award

www.loranscholar.ca/apply APPLY DIRECTLY TO THE LORAN FOUNDATION Value: up to \$100,000, \$5,000 and \$2,000 awards available.

Eligibility: Must be a graduating student, have a minimum cumulative average of **85%**, **over the past 3 years** be a Canadian Citizen or permanent resident, be at least 16 years of age by Sept. 1 of the following year.

Loran Awards are only tenable at **participating universities** in Canada, but finalist and provincial awards are tenable at any accredited public university in Canada.

Criteria: Must have outstanding service, leadership and character (integrity, humility, kindness, courage, tenacity and personal autonomy) and demonstrated a commitment to serving and improving their community/school.

Deadline OCTOBER 16th 2025.

<u>University of Toronto</u> <u>Book Award & U of T National Scholarships</u>

We may nominate one student for the U of T Book Award and they will also be our (1) nominee for the National Scholarship.

If you intend on applying U of T and would like to be nominated submit a brag sheet to Mrs HW by Oct 2.

- QUARMS Queens U Accelerated Route to Medicine is no longer linked to Chancellors Scholarship application— The goal of QuARMS is to offer a carefully selected group of up to 10 outstanding Black and/or Indigenous peoples that are graduating high school, an exciting and innovative 2-year pathway that culminates with application for admission to the 1st year of Med School at Queen's. UBC Major Entrance Awards

UBC Presidential Scholars Award (academic/leadership)

Apply to UBC through the online application by December 1 each year Select yes.

<u>International Scholars Award – Apply by Dec 1</u>

Centennial Scholars Entrance Award 80K and due December 1

(based on **financial need** and still be a strong academic student who is involved and meet all UBC admission requirements) Application is required Application form **(open Oct. 1)**

Scholarships for international students:

Apply to UBC by Jan. 15, 2025 to be automatically considered.

Awards for Aboriginal students: must self-identify on UBC application.

Beyond Tomorrow Scholaships - You must self-identify as Black (African, African-American, African-Canadian, Afro-Caribbean

- Submit your <u>UBC application</u> by <u>December 1.</u>
- Complete the <u>UBC Entrance Award Application</u> and select the Beyond Tomorrow Scholars Award by <u>December 1</u>.

SFU Entrance Awards

High School Entrance Scholarships, Awards, and Bursaries are only available to applicants applying to SFU for the Fall.

The Fall 2026 Undergraduate Scholars Entrance Scholarships application is open October 1 - December 15, 2025.

The Undergraduate Scholars Entrance Scholarship **(USES)** Program is designed to attract both **domestic and international** high school applicants who demonstrate potential to enrich the university community through ongoing academic and community contributions. The USES Program has a number of scholarships that range in value from \$20,000 to \$140,000. Eligible applicants will be considered for all USES Program scholarships **based on one application.**

(Other Entrance Scholarships may require individual applications.)

What can you do now – prepare and start:

Register for POST-SECONDARY INFO SESSIONS.

Post-Secondary reps are a wealth of information about **Financial Aid programs and Entrance Awards. Research** tuition costs and visit financial aid pages at your institution(s).

Maintain a scholarship file.

Make sure you have one or two referees/references.

Complete your brag sheet/Academic resume to provide to your referees. This helps them write a good concise letter!

The process is ongoing all year: Apps open and close throughout the year.

- Search: which awards match your criteria?
- Apply, apply, apply! Be aware of deadlines!
- Be clear and concise in your application. Use word counts to your advantage.
- Have your essay proof-read and seek feedback well in advance of the due date. Edit. Edit.
- Do not use companies like Grant Me to write your applications or essays – Donors may disqualify you. Do not use ChatGPT or Al
- In the essay, relate to the donor. This is your time to shine! Answer any questions. Highlight what experiences you have that make you stand out!

Notes: General Scholarship applications:

Follow the instructions! Do not apply if you do not meet the criteria.



The #1 complaint about scholarship essays "STUDENTS DON'T ANSWER THE QUESTION!"

- Tailor your application /essay to the donor's goals and criteria
- Know your competition/candidate pool:
- Centennial only (school based) or
- Coquitlam (Local) or
- BC (Provincial) or
- Canada-wide

Note: Local & Community awards = best odds & less competition!

Strategies for Winning Scholarships ... JUST START.

You can't win if you don't play.

- 25% of graduating students don't apply for any funding!
- Even among talented students, winning money involves a bit of luck, not just skill.
- To win more scholarships, apply to more scholarships!
- It gets easier after your first few applications!
- Essays can be reused and tailored to each new application

Writing a Winning Scholarship Essay or Personal profile. There are plenty of tips on the Career Centre page

- Answer the essay question orally and transcribe the recording
- Use an outline to organize your thoughts
- Give specific examples unique to YOU!
- Personalize your essay and be passionate! Brag a bit!
- Write about something of interest to <u>you!</u> This makes the reader more interested.
- Talk about your impact on other people and the impact of your experiences...what did you learn.
- DO NOT USE CHATGPT, ESSAY WRITERS OR AI.



Grade 12 is YOUR best opportunity to win a scholarship! There will never be a time with more opportunities and less competition than your grad year.

A scholarship search is...

NOT "quick and easy." It can be a lot of work!

Expect to spend a lot of time finding leads and researching, editing your essay, filling out applications, asking for references.

May 30th
Hi Ms. Healeywright,
I understand it may be late, but I would like help finding scholarships.

I've been going through quite a lot of scholarship websites and haven't found any I qualify for.
Thanks.

Please DO NOT come to see me in MAY!

Most sholarships will have closed by then. Start to prepare now.

Scholarship funding is... **NOT** <u>fast</u> money! HAVE A GAME PLAN! Talk to your parents about your tuition & costs.

There is usually a 4 to 6 month delay between the time you start and the earliest you might receive funding. Your first semester tuition and fees will be due (usually in full) in August!

Make the time: If you spend 3 hours applying for a scholarship ... $51,250 = \underline{73 \text{ hours of p/t work.} }$ 55,000 = 294 hours of p/t work

Beware....There are no 'guarantees'!

You might apply and receive nothing.

Anyone who "guarantees" scholarship money or asks for money up front is probably a scam artist. Beware! Contests can be a way of getting your information.

\$uccess is possible!

Centennial Grads have WON:

- 2025 Terry Fox Humanitarian Award \$28,000
- 2022 and 2024 U of T Arbor scholars \$20K.
- Cmolik 40K, Beedie 30K and SFU Uggla (full ride) won in 2023 and 2024!
- 2020 Schulich Leader winner: \$80,000.
- Most grads who apply to our local package and/or District Authority Awards (\$1250) and meet all criteria will win.(Spring)
- For Bursaries, **financial need/low income** is in the criteria. If you are unsure whether you qualify for bursaries see your counsellor.
- Community service/School involvement is in the criteria for many external awards & most community awards. Get involved!

Fall 2026 Application Timeline - BC Schools

MOST WILL OPEN OCT 1ST

Apply via Education Planner BC Application system (create account)

Douglas College – Applications OPEN Oct. 1 Apply for limited entry right away

SFU – Applications OPEN Oct. 1SFU Application deadline is Jan 31

SFU USES Entrance Scholarship deadline Dec. 15

UBC – Apply by **Dec. 1** to be considered for the UBC Major Entrance Scholarships.

Application Deadline is Jan. 15

UVic (open)—Application deadline is Jan 31 (most programs)

Capilano U – (Oct 7) Entrance Awards deadline March 1, 2025. 1.9 million in 2025

BCIT – Applications open **Oct 1** until full or by deadline date. Apps for trades programs accepted all year. (rotating).

(Many BCIT programs are competitive. Apply early! Double check- some programs do not accept direct high school applicants & require post-secondary credits to apply) Get a DVR from your counsellor.
