

One page paper outlining why the applicant wants to pursue a career in Trades, Visual Arts or Fine & Performing Arts. Applicants are encouraged to include any information demonstrating financial need.

Equity Scholarship (4 x \$1500) – these scholarships will be awarded to students who identify as *Indigenous*, *Black*, *a person of colour*, *LGBTQ2S+*, *or a person with a disability*.
