SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Construction on the new 12-plex is well underway! This addition marks a significant step forward in expanding our learning spaces and enhancing the school environment for all students.

As we navigate this busy phase, we ask for your continued patience and cooperation with traffic flow around the school. For safety reasons, please do not stop to drop off your child in the west-to-east lane adjacent to the angular staff parking stalls. This area is not designated for student drop-off and stopping here creates a dangerous backlog that puts both students and staff at risk.

We understand that construction can bring temporary inconvenience, and we truly appreciate your support in keeping our school community safe and moving smoothly.

SCHOOL PHOTO DAY FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 5

All students, regardless of grade, must have their photo taken even if they choose not to purchase photos. Individual student photos are needed for the yearbook, student ID cards and the school data base. As photos are used for identification purposes, students are to be reminded that hats, props, masks are not to be worn. SCHEDULE CORRECTIONS AND ADJUSTMENTS

PLEASE DO NOT COME TO THE COUNSELLOR'S OFFICE UNLESS YOU HAVE AN APPOINTMENT

We have built our timetable based on student choices made back in the spring. We have very limited room to adjust schedules. Schedule changes will be prioritized in the following manner.

- 1. Students with an incomplete timetable (fewer than 8 courses)
- 2. Students who took summer school and either no longer need the course or need to repeat it
- 3. Students who are missing a course for a desired post-secondary area of study

Please be aware that we cannot change schedules for the following reasons:

- 1. Wanting a different elective
- 2. Wanting a different teacher
- 3. Wanting a class with a friend
- 4. Wanting a class/lunch in a different block

EXPECTATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES FOR A SUCCESSFUL YEAR

As members of this school community, we have responsibilities to ourselves and to each other that go far beyond words. It is our expectation that you keep the following things first and foremost in your minds:

- Be kind and respectful of each member of this community. Be respectful of the building and be respectful of our neighbors and businesses.
- Do your best in your classes and put in the effort. Success is not automatic, and it will take work. Do not look for the easy way out. Grit and resilience are essential to achieving success both at school and the world beyond
- Student athletes are students first. If you want to represent the school and participate in athletics, you need to ensure you are taking care of your academics
- Participation in the fun stuff and the memorable events and ceremonies, including graduation events is not a right, it is a privilege earned. Students who demonstrate poor attendance and do not adhere to the Code of Conduct may find themselves not attending these milestone events
- Be exceptionally mindful of the things you do and say on social media. Think about things before you hit send.
- Do not bring vapes or any sort of smoking device to school, electronic or otherwise. The use and possession of these devices is strictly prohibited. If you are caught with a vape it will be confiscated, your parents will be notified and you will be subject to the consequences outlined in the school Code of Conduct.
- Attendance Students are expected to be in school and on time on all days when school is in session. Research
 indicates that poor attendance disrupts the continuity of instruction and once lost instruction is difficult to recover.
 Our attendance expectations are clearly detailed on page 9 of our school planners. Planners were distributed to
 Grade 9's and limited copies will be available at the office.

BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE

Dr. Charles Best Secondary is a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) school as many of our classrooms use laptops on a regular basis. If your student does not have a device, we have a laptop loaner program operated through our school library. Students requiring a loaner laptop can come to the main office to receive a form to apply for a temporary device.

Please note this process takes a few days. Laptops will not be loaned out the same day.

NOTE: Student cell phones are not considered as a learning device. Cell phones are to be appropriately stored during instructional time, unless the teacher directs students to use them for classroom purposes.

Recommended Laptop Specs include:

- A minimum of 13-inch screen
- A full-sized keyboard
- Touch screens are not necessary.
- Hard Drive of 256GB or more
- Ram of 8GB or more

CELL PHONE EXPECTATIONS

At Dr. Charles Best Secondary, responsible cell phone use is essential to fostering an environment of respect and academic excellence. Teachers will review these expectations with their Advisory classes on September 2nd as well as in individual classes to ensure every student is aware of them.

Cell Phone Language from the Code of Conduct reads:

Personal Digital Devices in Schools:

All cellular phones or similar personal communication devices are to be appropriately stored during class time. Digital devices of any kind are only to be used **at the discretion of your teacher** when identified as appropriate for your learning environment or because of unique circumstances. Any use of personal digital devices at school is subject to all other expectations for conduct and use of technology, including AP 140.2 Digital Responsibility for Students. All Cellular phones or similar personal communication devices are to be appropriately stored during class time. Digital devices of any kind are only to be used at the discretion of your teacher when identified as appropriate for your learning environment or because of unique circumstances. The practice of many teachers is the use of cell phone hotels in their classrooms. Students will be required to place their device in the hotel for the duration of the class.

DROP OFF/PICK UP

We have an extended day schedule. We have a few classes that start at 7:00 am and we have a few classes that start at 3:20 pm but most of our students attend between 8:16 am and 3:13 pm. Please know that students are expected to be in their classrooms by 8:16 or if they start in Period 2 then 9:40 am. Students should arrive at school with enough time to get organized and get to class by these times. We have two main areas: the front of the school and the upper parking lot. Please understand that our drop-off and pick up areas get VERY congested so please plan for the extra time and we ask that you are patient, kind and careful. If your schedule allows, you might consider dropping your child off a little earlier than the rush and picking up a little later than the rush and maybe we can spread out the congestion. Please help us as we try to maintain a safe and efficient lot for your children and our staff.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

There is no specific school supply list. Please bring basic supplies on the first day of regular classes including your personal device. Individual teachers will specify if other items are required.

REPORTING AN ABSENCE

Parents, if your child is not able to attend school on Tuesday, September 2nd, please contact the office by phone or email the school office at charlesbestattendance@sd43.bc.ca. It is important to know if your child will be attending Dr. Charles Best Secondary and/or will be returning on a certain date. For any absences throughout the year please use the same email above. It can be found on our school website home page under quick links "Absence Report." Emails to alert teachers of an absence are not necessary but are not discouraged. The office is the first place to alert the school of an absence, thankyou!

SCHOOL LOCKERS *NEW ONLINE SIGN UP THIS YEAR

Grade 9 students (and their parents) were emailed locker sign up information this afternoon. Please check your emails for the login information.

Grade 10-12 students will receive an email soon. Please remember the following about lockers this year:

- Students are responsible for the locker they choose all year and will return the lock and combo tag to the main office in June
- **NOTE:** personal locks are **NOT** permitted on regular lockers. If used, they will be removed at the owner's expense.
- Small blue lockers located outside the large gym are for <u>PE students ONLY</u>. These lockers do not have locks attached so belongings are lefts at the owner's risk. Personal locks *may be used* on these lockers *ONLY* and must be removed at the end of first semester so second semester PE students can be afforded the same opportunity.

FORM UPDATES FOR 2025-2026

As our district continues to move towards digitization of student forms to ensure the confidentiality of personal information, parents/guardians will be required to complete some on-line forms and to submit an information verification form during the first few weeks. Most forms and fees will be completed through https://sd43.schoolcashonline.com/ and includes District Policy, School Volunteer form, Volunteer Driver Application.

Student Information Verification forms will be published to Parent MYED portals beginning September 2 and will be available to update until Friday, September 19th.

Medical Forms: It is extremely important we have the most up to date information for students **ASAP** with medical or life-threatening alerts **EACH YEAR**. Parents, please navigate to our school website homepage to find these important forms under the top tab "Parents". Please fill out applicable forms as soon as possible and have the forms returned to the office. Thank you for helping us with this!

STUDENT VEHICLE REGISTRATION

There will once again be limited student parking FOR GRADE 12 STUDENTS this year due to ongoing construction. Limited parking spots will be available for **GRADE 12 students** in the upper parking lot. Vehicle registration forms will be handed out to grade 12's during Tuesday September 2nd advisories to Grade 12's who currently have a valid 'N' license. The form must be filled out in its entirety and signed by a parent/guardian.

There will be short waiting period to obtain the pass once application forms are received at the office. Students will be called down once their pass is approved by Administration. If you currently have an 'L', please wait until you have passed your 'N' driving test. Once a parking permit is issued, students MUST display their permit in their vehicle or will run the risk of losing their parking privileges.

E-BIKES AND E-SCOOTERS

The BC government has recently updated their regulations for E-bikes and E-scooters to highlight the importance of safety. It's worth noting that E-scooters are permitted to be operated by anyone 16 years of age or older. "Light E-bikes" (max 250W) are permitted to be operated by anyone 14 years of age or older, while "Standard E-bikes" (max 500W) are permitted to be operated by anyone 16 years of age or older. There are also regulations pertaining to where E-bikes and E-scooters are permitted to be operated.

For the safety of students and staff, those old enough to ride E-bikes and E-scooters should operate them with caution on and around school district properties.
