GRADE 9 IMMUNIZATIONS:

Grade 9 immunizations are quickly approaching **Friday Feb. 9th**, **Friday Feb. 16th**, **and Friday March 1st**. Today, during your child's period 5 class, they received their individualized consent package. Parents are asked to sign and have their child return to the school on Monday to their period 5 teacher. After Monday, students can drop them off at the main office. Signed consent packages are to be submitted to the main office NO LATER than Wednesday, January 31st. Fraser Health needs to pick up the packages well in advance of the first immunization day.
