# **REMINDER: STUDENT LEARNING SURVEY 2024**

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size, and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

Early in 2024 the Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grades 10, their parents/guardians/caregivers, and all school staff. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province. The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at <a href="http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat\_survey">http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat\_survey</a>. Any computer with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link without a logon code by selecting the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the Results section.

# **BUS DRIVERS WANTED (WITH AN HONORARIUM)**

We are looking for any qualified drivers (with a Class 2 License) to be called upon from time to time to drive a school bus, and to assist with the transport of students at our schools. The volunteer driver can be paid an honorarium, and trips are typically booked well in advance. Drivers typically pick up a bus from the designated secondary school, provide the transportation to students at the school for which they have been reserved, and then return the bus to the secondary school when they have finished. All volunteer drivers must be approved by the principal, must fill out a District Volunteer Driver Form, must complete a Police Information Check and provide a Driver's Abstract from ICBC to the school. Drivers can limit their driving to the school of their choice but can also make themselves available to other schools if they wish.

#### **PINK SHIRT DAY**

Wear a pink shirt on **Wednesday, February 28**<sup>th</sup> to celebrate Pink Shirt Day.

Pink Shirt Day is an annual event against bullying, held in Canada and New Zealand. Participants wear pink shirts and attend or host informative events to raise awareness about bullying, particularly in schools. Pink Shirt Day was started in 2007 in Canada, where it is held on the last Wednesday of February each year.

# Free information session: How to co-exist safely with coyotes

Sign up to attend a free information session to learn how to co-exist safely with urban coyotes.

Coquitlam and Port Moody are collaborating with the Stanley Park Ecology Society for the second year to provide information on common misconceptions about urban coyotes, as well as tips to help keep your family and pets safe.

#### Register to attend one of two free information sessions

Coyote breeding season is underway now through April, which means they will be more active as they secure and protect territory. Residents may hear coyotes howling and yipping more often as they communicate with each other and establish their territories and may even come across coyotes while the animals are active and seeking mates.

Minimizing conflicts between coyotes, humans, and pets is important in protecting the safety of our community, and our urban wildlife. Coyotes have a vital role to play in the urban ecosystem as they help control the population of rodents and other wildlife.

Presented by Dezirae Barreto from the Stanley Park Ecology Society, each one-hour session will provide information about coyote breeding season, common misconceptions about urban coyotes, what to do if you encounter a coyote, and ways to manage attractants. All ages are welcome to attend.
