# CAPSTONE DAY JANUARY 26<sup>TH</sup>, 2023: MANDATORY FOR GRADE 12'S

Capstone Day is mandatory for grade 12 students. Completion of a capstone presentation as part of CLC12 is required for graduation. Grade 12 students have signed up for a 1-hour slot on Jan. 26<sup>th</sup> (Sign-up in Room 309). Grade 12's are required to stay for their full hour to present and listen to two peer presentations. Following presentations, Grade 12's are invited to the Cafeteria for some grad celebrations!!

Capstone Day & YDI Survey, Jan. 26th: Recommended for Grade 11's

Grade 11 students will be assigned a two-hour block (AM or PM) on Jan. 26<sup>th</sup>. Schedules (times/locations) for Grade 11's will be posted in the front foyer and in Room 309 starting Tuesday. For one hour, Grade 11's are asked to complete the "Youth Development Instrument" survey, <a href="https://earlylearning.ubc.ca/monitoring-system/ydi/ydi-overview/">https://earlylearning.ubc.ca/monitoring-system/ydi/ydi-overview/</a>. For one hour, Grade 11's are invited to listen to Grade 12 capstone presentations so that they can start conceptualizing their graduation project. For supervision reasons, Grade 11's must attend in assigned rooms.

#### LAST WEEK OF JANUARY

In a semester system, the last week of January is, in many ways, equivalent to the end of a school year as all students will be starting a fresh load of courses on Jan 31, 2023. Thus, from Jan 23-28, instructional time at Dr Charles Best will look different than the rest of the semester in order for us to accommodate various educational requirements. All regular classes are cancelled that week and instead, the following will occur:

- All students enrolled in Sem 1 French Language Arts 12 will complete the French Literacy 12 Provincial Assessment required for graduation (French Immersion dual diploma)
  - Written Component Jan 25 am
  - Oral Component Jan 23 am
- All students enrolled in Sem 1 English Language Arts 10 will write the Literacy 10 Provincial Assessment required for graduation Jan 23 pm
- All students enrolled in Sem 1 Math 10 will write the Numeracy 10 Provincial Assessment required for graduation Jan 24 am
- All students enrolled in Sem 1 English Language Arts 12 will write the Literacy 12 Provincial Assessment required for graduation Jan 24 pm
- All Grade 9's will attend an assembly in the big gym as a component of both their Physical Health Education 9 and Digital Literacy 10 courses Jan 23 am
- All Grade 12's will present their Capstone Project Jan 26
- All Grade 11's will complete the Youth Development Survey and participate in Capstone presentations as an audience member Jan 26
- Select students will attend school to support the Grade 8 tour Jan 27
- Select students may need to write Provincial Assessments on alternate dates -Jan 25-27
