

IMPORTANT MESSAGE FOR ANY STUDENTS WHO RIDE PUBLIC TRANSIT

Trankslink has informed us that many of our students are claiming that they are 12 years old and therefore do not have to pay their transit fare. Please know that this is a warning to tell you, Translink will submit the audio and video recordings of our students getting on the bus at Como Lake Village, or in front of our school who claim they are 12 years old. Translink will issue tickets to you and if you do not pay those tickets, they send them to collection agencies etc. It does not look good for our school as well, when Translink explains that many of our students are doing this, not just one or two. Please be a responsible citizen in our community and pay your bus fare. You should bring your student ID so that you can pay the Concession (Student) rate.

They have assigned two officers to our bus runs every day so please be aware and be responsible.

If you must ride public transit and you are having trouble covering this fee, please parents, contact your child's Vice Principal. We can help you get bus passes etc. Parents, we really need some help with this. Thank you so much.
