PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Sign up for Sem. 1 parent/teachers interviews begins at 3pm and will be open until 11:59pm on Tuesday, October 28th.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY. Link to book follows below. Important program instructions are attached.

- From the home page, please select the correct province and then our school. We are listed as: Dr. Charles Best Secondary-Coquitlam, BC
- The program has been reset from last spring. All users are to register and create an account.
- Ensure you are registered for <u>EACH</u> child you have in the school.
- Please book only 1 time slot per teacher.
- We have teachers with the same last name in our school. Please check with your child to confirm.
- The system is broken into 2 schedules (VIRTUAL OR IN PERSON). Please pay attention when you are booking.
- You are permitted to book in both schedules if you choose to do a combination of virtual and in-person interviews.
- In the event a teacher is fully booked, please email the teacher directly to set up an alternate time.

FOR ALL INTERVIEWS:

- Please do not book an appointment regarding your child's S2 courses or full year/linear course(s) as there is not
 enough data compiled for teachers to speak about. These courses will show as (FY) on your child's schedule and
 are typically run before or after school. Also included are CLC 12 and Digital Learning. Parents are welcome to
 schedule an appointment regarding full year courses during our Semester 2 interviews which will be held on
 Thursday, March 12, 2026.
- Both appointment types are to be booked online using the link below.

One schedule will allow you to book <u>VIRTUAL</u> interviews (on TEAMS from 2:00pm-4:00pm)

- Interviews will be 8-10 minutes in length
- Do not come to the school during this session
- Teachers may or may not send a TEAMS invite. It's okay if you don't receive one
- You will need your child's/children's TEAMS login information for interviews where no invite is sent
- If an invite is sent, click on the link to join ensuring your camera and microphone is on
- Be ready for your interview 5 minutes prior to your scheduled appointment with camera and microphone on
- Should an issue arise, please have your phone ready in case the teacher tries to call.
- Do not call the office, please email the teacher if there are connection issues

One schedule will allow you to book <u>IN PERSON</u> interviews (in the school from 5:00pm-7:00pm)

- Interviews will be 8-10 minutes in length
- Most interviews will be held in the gyms or Counsellor offices. Please check each teacher in case an alternate location is provided. (Electric Train in Trades)
- Signage and student leaders will be on hand to assist
- Drop-in appointments are NOT available as teachers will have information prepped about your child ahead of time

OCTOBER IS ADHA AWARENESS MONTH

October is ADHD Awareness Month and aims to increase understanding and reduce stigma. It highlights the challenges faced by individuals with ADHD, including issues with focus, impulse control, and organization. The month also promotes advocacy for better diagnosis, treatment, and support for those living with ADHD.

Three common executive functioning deficits in individuals with ADHD are:

- 1. Inattention: Difficulty sustaining focus on tasks, leading to distractions, forgetfulness, and trouble following through on instructions or completing projects.
- 2. Impulsivity: Struggling with impulse control, leading to hasty decision-making, interruptions in conversations, and challenges in regulating emotions or behaviors in response to situations.
- 3. **Time Management and Organization**: Difficulty planning, prioritizing, and managing time effectively, often resulting in procrastination, missed deadlines, and disorganization in both physical and mental spaces.

People with ADHD need to discover personalized strategies that work best for their unique challenges, since standard approaches may not be effective for everyone.
