TRACK AND FIELD RESULTS

Results are in from the Coquitlam/Maple Ridge/Pitt Meadows District Championships that the track & field team competed in the last two days. Top 8 in each event qualified for the Zone Championships. All told, we had 21 athletes and 4 relay teams qualify for Zones. Some of the standout performances included:

Lana K placing 2nd in the 80mH and High Jump
Ben G winning the Sr. Boys Hammer and placing 3rd in the Discus
Michela B winning the Sr. Girls 200m and 400m
Diana Z winning the Jr. Girls 1500m and 3000m

Sr. Girls 4x100m Relay placing first (in a time that would have placed them 4th in the Sr. Boys race) There were a number of personal bests and gutsy efforts outside of this. The kids all competed really well.
