Delaney S.: 1st, JrG 300m Hurdles (for those keeping score, she won 3 individual events + SrG 4x100m relay)

Makenna S.: 1st, JrG 100m + 1st, JrG Long Jump (also won 3 events + SrG 4x100m relay)

Diana Z.: 1st, JrG 1500m

Michela B.: 2nd, SrG 400m (Michela won the 200m yesterday + SrG 4x100m relay)

Other notable results over the last two days:

Kate P.: 8th, SrG 100m (she also placed 3rd in the SrG Pole Vault and is on the SrG 4x100m)

James H.: 5th, SrB 1500m and 5th, SrB 800m (800m was yesterday)

Manuela M.: 5th, JrG 800m (also yesterday)

Must demonstrate academic merit and financial need.

HORATIO ALGER VOCATIONAL & TECHNICAL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Students who are planning to enrol in a 3-years or less career or technical training program this Fall, may be eligible to apply. Must be Canadian citizen, have demonstrated critical financial need (<\$65,000/ family), and have demonstrated perseverance in overcoming adversity. 25x \$3,000. Apply here by June 15.
