*UPDATED INFO - GRAD COMPASS CARD PASSES FOR PUBLIC TRANSIT

Grads can pick up 2 GradPass Compass cards for free rides on Translink Buses, SeaBuses, Skytrains or West Coast Express. Each pass is valid for one full day of unlimited travel.

Your Compass GradPass must be used in conjunction with your valid secondary school or government issued photo ID and is **valid from May 15-June 30.**

LAST CHANCE - CTA SCHOLARSHIPS

Multiple available, ranging from \$500 to \$1,500. Open only to students in SD43: Students pursuing a career in Trades or a career in Visual Arts or Fine & Performing Arts, Equity deserving students such as Indigenous, Black, a person of colour, LGBTQ2S+, or a person with a disability. HORATIO ALGER VOCATIONAL & TECHNICAL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Students who are planning to enrol in a 3-years or less career or technical training program this Fall, may be eligible to apply. Must be Canadian citizen, have demonstrated critical financial need (<\$65,000/ family), and have demonstrated perseverance in overcoming adversity. 25x \$3,000. Apply here by June 15.

On Friday, May 26th, SD43's Mountain Bike team including Charles Best students travelled to Rossland BC to compete at Provincials. The competition included almost 500 riders from all over BC lining up for the XC race.

Our team competed well and completed the 10km course in under 1hr 15min.

In the Enduro race, the riders climbed 440m to get to the 2 different start lines which included a mix of technical steep descents and flowing jump trails. Our riders excelled on these stages and were proud of their personal tmes with 2 riders placing 11th in their field.
