## YEARBOOK PICKUP GRADES 9-11

## **PROVINCIAL ASSESSMENTS**

- 1. If you wrote in April, you can access results in the portal **now** 
  - a. Student logon to their MyEd profile.
  - b. Click on the top tab "MyInfo"
  - c. Click on the side tap "Assessments". All of the Assessments you have taken will be listed.
  - d. Click on the Assessment you wish to view to see your result.
- 2. If you are scheduled to write in June 2023, you should have received an email indicating the time and place to do so. Only students in FRAL 12 this semester and those who missed previous exam sessions will need to attend the June sitting of exams.
- 3. If you have **not** written an assessment, you know you need to write (Literacy 10, Numeracy 10 or Literacy 12), please see Ms Thibault in the main office immediately as we need to register you for those missing assessments right away.

#### TRACK AND FIELD PROVINCIAL RESULTS DAY 2

**Delaney S.** won the JrG 80mH in a very fast 11.99 seconds. Her best time ever in the event and (we think maybe?) a JrG meet record.

Makenna S. followed that up with a convincing win in the JrG 100m.

(Both Delaney and Makenna won these events last year as well.)

**Lana K.** JUST missed qualifying for the JrG 80mH final. She ran 13.41, and needed 13.36 to get in. Fine margins! **Kate P.** equaled her best height in the SrG Pole Vault (2.30m) to finish 7<sup>th</sup>.

Michela B. ran very strong in the SrG 400m to finish 4<sup>th</sup>.

An impressive result as this is her first year running this event.

**Jalal Z.** raced in the Athletes with Disabilities 400m and ran really well, placing 3<sup>rd</sup> in 69.93 seconds.

Thanks to **Ms. Pipe** for getting him out to the meet!

Our SrG 4x100m ran into some exchange trouble and finished 7<sup>th</sup>. This was a bit gutting, as we are definitely the fastest team on paper. Just couldn't get the baton around efficiently. Oh well. Always next year.

Makenna closed out the day with a 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish in the JrG Long Jump.

Manuela Meyang ran a strong race in the JrG 800m heats, coming within a second of her PB, but didn't qualify for the final. I feel this was a great learning experience for Manuela and she'll be back next year.

#### TRACK AND FIELD PROVINCIAL RESULTS DAY 3

**Zoe O.** walked to a PB and 17<sup>th</sup> place finish in the SrG 1500m Racewalk.

Her brother **Quinton O.** also walked to a big PB to finish 19<sup>th</sup> in the JrB 1500m Racewalk.

**Michela B.** followed up her strong 4<sup>th</sup> place in the SrG 400m yesterday with a 6<sup>th</sup> place finish in the 200m. She wasn't particularly happy with her time, but 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> is a solid meet by any standard. Two individual events plus the 4x100m relay is a tough triple.

**Diana Z.** ran a PB in the JrG 3000m to place 10<sup>th</sup>. She ran very smart and very patient... if I can get her to swap her swimsuit for a pair of track spikes, she might really do some damage next year.

Lana K. jumped 1.50m to place 10<sup>th</sup> in the JrG High Jump. Again, a good learning experience for a grade 9. Finally, Makenna and Delaney S. (you may have heard their names previously) closed out their meets really well. On tired legs, Makenna ran to 3<sup>rd</sup> in the JrG 200m (just 0.02 seconds off 2<sup>nd</sup>). Delaney SMASHED the field in the 300mH, winning handily. She then jumped 1.55m in the JrG High Jump to take 4<sup>th</sup>. I would like to note that these girls did 4 events over the last three days (3 individual events + 4x100m relay).

## **CLC REQUIREMENTS**

## Grade 12's must be passing CLC12 to pick up Cap/Gown on June 14th.

Grade 12's who are not passing CLC12 will not be able to pick up their cap/gown and commencement tickets next week. To pass CLC12, students must do all of the following: complete Capstone, turn in evidence of 30 hours work/volunteer, and 2+ CYOA Assignments. The CLC12 room (Room 309) is open every block, every day to provide one-on-one support. Students with outstanding work should attend room 309 during their off block. Questions?
