GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

AVAILABLE NOW - LEARNING UPDATES (FORMERLY KNOWN AS "IN-TERM REPORTS")

Parents, October Learning Updates are a snapshot of how your child is progressing in each of their courses. This early in the term, many classes do not have enough evidence of learning to what level of proficiency or grade your child has, but instead, the report describes whether or not they are engaged, participating, applying appropriate effort and skill i.e., are they doing what they should be doing to be successful in the course. Teachers will also indicate at the bottom of the Learning Update if they suggest a Parent-Teacher meeting on Oct 18th.

The Ministry of Education's new Reporting Order allows for flexibility in how you receive these Learning Updates from each of your child's teachers; please ask your child how the report was created in each class:

YMCA SUMMER WORK EXCHANGE INFO MEETING

The YMCA Summer Work Student Exchange (SWSE) program offers youth aged 16-17 the opportunity to gain paid work experience, practice their second official language skills, and explore another Canadian community through a 6-week exchange to Québec during the summer. Students live with a host family in Québec and are paid to work full-time at a non-profit organization or public sector job such as a summer camp, childcare centre, community museum, etc. SWSE is funded by the Department of Canadian Heritage and is offered at minimal cost (\$150) to participants; this includes transportation to and from Québec, as well as all program activities. This is an excellent opportunity for youth to enhance their French skills through immersion. Come to our info meeting on **Mon, October 16,** after school and learn more (location tba).
