CTA SCHOLARSHIPS (EXCLUSIVELY FOR SD43 GRADUATES)

- **Equity Scholarships**: 4 x \$1,500 will be awarded to graduating SD43 students who identify as Indigenous, Black, a person of colour, LGBTQ2S+, or a person with a disability. <u>Application form.</u>
- Trades or Arts Scholarships: 2 x \$1,500 for graduating students who are planning to pursue a career in Trades or a career in Visual Arts or Fine & Performing Arts.
