Graduation Program – Grades 10, 11 and 12

Requirements: The BC Ministry of Education requires students to complete a **MINIMUM of 80** credits (each course has a 4 credit value unless otherwise specified). **Four courses (16 credits) must be completed at the grade 12 level (which includes English 12).** Most students graduate with more than 80 credits. One course designated **Applied Design, Skills and Technologies (ADST)** or **Arts Education (AE)** must also be taken at the Grade 10, 11 or 12 level. For more information, please refer to the Course Planning book on the Charles Best website.

1. **Goal Setting:** Research indicates that when goals are written down, people are more likely to achieve them. With this in mind, please plan for the next two years to make sure you will have all the courses you need to reach your goals. We recognize that you may change your mind and invite you to discuss your plans with your counsellor, teachers, family, friends, etc. to clarify your goals.
2. **Research:** It is strongly recommended that **Grade 10, 11 and 12 students consult with the Career Resource Facilitator in the Career Centre for information on Post-Secondary options and requirements for entry to specific programs.**
3. **Course Selection:** **English Program** **French Immersion Program** **English as an Additional Language (EAL)**
- **Required Courses:** A minimum of **8 courses** must be taken in one school year. They would include the following:
 - **English Program:** English 10, Career Life Education 10, Social Studies 10, a Math 10, PE 10 and a Science 10.
 - **French Immersion Program:** English 10, Sciences Humaines 10, a Math 10, a Science 10, Français Langue 10, Vie et Carrière 10, Education Physique 10
- **Electives:** Consult the Course List (on the reverse) and Course Guide (available on the CBSS website) and **choose electives in order of priority.** List them below on this page. *Although every effort is made to ensure you get your top choice electives, there may be times where we need to input your Alternate choices.* **PLEASE CHOOSE CAREFULLY!**

Secondary School Apprenticeships – This program is available for Industry Training programs not available through the Coquitlam School District. However, Coquitlam offers an opportunity for students to begin an apprenticeship program while still enrolled in secondary school. **ACE IT Trade Preparation Programs – Camosun College** – SD43 offers a variety of Industry Training Programs. Students take their academic courses at Charles Best and depending on what program they choose, attend an alternate site for their skill development courses.
