# **General Application Procedure**

# Join the "BEST CAREER CENTRE TEAM"!

Make sure to check back to the "2024 Grads – Local Scholarship Package" channel often. Latest updates will be posted there. External scholarship forms can be found there under "files".

#### A. INTERNAL VS. EXTERNAL SCHOLARSHIPS

When looking through this scholarship package you will notice two things. One, all listed scholarships are *local* which means only a small group of students is eligible to apply. Second, we have separated the available scholarships into three groups:

<u>Group 1 - Internal scholarships:</u> Scholarships and bursaries listed in this group are administered by Dr. Charles Best Secondary School. You apply using our <u>online application form</u>, and our school's scholarship committee will choose the successful candidate. This includes the District Authority Awards (page 6).

<u>Group 2 – External scholarships administered by SD43:</u> All awards in this category require a separate application. The successful candidates will be chosen by a district scholarship committee. (\*If we collect the application/ essay we obviously have to forward those to the district committee, but we will not share the financial need form if one is required and will only use it internally.) Please note the different application deadlines and eligibility criteria. Make sure to understand the provided instructions on how to apply (i.e., which form to use, additional documentation required). If you have any question, contact Ms. Kaufmann at skaufmann@sd43.bc.ca

<u>Group 3 – Other external local scholarships:</u> These awards are only listed in the booklet to make you aware that these opportunities are available. While some donors may have asked us to collect the applications, the school is not involved in the selection process.

#### B. GROUP 1 & 2 AWARDS: WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

- ✓ Must be Canadian Citizen, or Permanent Resident.
- ✓ Must have a Social Insurance Number.
- ✓ Must be in a minimum of 7 classes in grade 12 year at Best.
- ✓ Must be planning to pursue post-secondary education after graduation (individual scholarship may have more specific requirements regarding the program of study)

## C. HOW TO APPLY

## Applying for internal local scholarships (Group 1):

Submit **our online application form** to apply for all internal scholarships for which you meet the criteria. At the end of the form, you will be asked to upload required documents. See list below. All documents must be uploaded in pdf format. If a required document for a specific scholarship is missing, you won't be considered. We will not follow up regarding missing documentation. Read instructions carefully and use the checklist below to ensure that you've uploaded all required documents before submitting your application online.

If your family income is outside of the listed guidelines but you believe that you should qualify for need-based awards, please explain your special circumstances on the form.

You must submit an external application form as determined by the donor. Please read the scholarship description carefully to fully understand the required steps. Take note of specific deadlines. If you have any questions, please contact Mrs. Kaufmann.

# Follow instructions carefully!

# **Tips for Success**

- ✓ A personal letter should **NOT** be a repeat of your resumé! Tell the scholarship committee what makes you unique. Portray your character. Who are you? What is important to you? How does this relate to your future goals and plans? The strongest responses are usually personal and specific.
- When applying for individual scholarships, please make sure to provide a reasonable response to the question "How do you meet the criteria for this scholarship". Again, be personal, be specific in your reasoning. Make sure you understand the question/ your task. "How do you meet the criteria?" is different from the personal letter we are asking for. Explain how your unique experiences match the listed scholarship criteria and make you the most suitable candidate. If the criteria are asking for leadership, make sure to demonstrate examples of your leadership, rather than just participation. If it's about citizenship/ community service, reflect on how you have demonstrated those. In contrast, the personal letter should give us an idea of who you are as a person. In many cases donors request to see your response to how you have demonstrated the scholarship criteria before they approve our selected candidate, so please note that this response might be shared with the donor.
- ✓ It is recommended to draft your responses to "How do you meet the criteria" for a specific scholarship in MS Word, and copy/ paste your answer into the online application form. The online form doesn't save your responses until you've submitted, and you don't want to risk losing your work.
- ✓ Do not just list your achievements but <u>reflect</u> and explain what they have taught you.
- ✓ Be original but not bizarre; be yourself!
- ✓ Be concise.
- ✓ Take a break, spend time away from your draft to decide if you still consider your responses interesting and well fitting.
- ✓ Reference letters should be requested AT LEAST TWO WEEKS in advance of the due date. Please remember that SD43 staff will not be available during Spring Break.
- ✓ Proofread! Edit! Leave it until the next day, then read it again. Revise! Edit! Proofread again.

## **DISTRICT/ AUTHORITY AWARD SCHOLARSHIPS** (Number to be confirmed, usually 34-36 available.)

Winners receive a **\$1250** scholarship voucher for post-secondary tuition. While recipients will be announced at commencement in June, more information and funds will be distributed in late fall directly through the Ministry of Education. Students have 5 years to redeem their voucher (only valid at designated PSI, see info below).

## **Basic Eligibility Requirements:**

- Must be Canadian citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant). Must be a BC resident.
- Be graduating in the same year the scholarship is awarded (early grad is okay).
- Will be attending a post-secondary institution that is <u>designated by the Province of B.C.</u> (i.e., approved for Canada Student Loans) or a program provider that is <u>approved by the Industry Training Authority</u>. *Please check if your PSI is deemed designated or approved*.
- Meet the selection criteria for each scholarship, see below.

The District/Authority scholarship recognizes high school graduates who have demonstrated excellence in one of seven non-academic focus areas. (Choose from 7 focus areas below)

## Criteria include:

- **❖** Demonstration of outstanding achievement in one of the focus areas listed below.
