STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

For financial aid and applications to post-secondary institutions, students should research how the application process works. It is the student's responsibility to check current deadlines and to check the appropriate websites for possible updated requirements, to complete necessary documentation and to make their submissions before the deadlines. (However, do not hesitate to see Ms. Kaufmann with any question.)

SOME OPTIONS FOR PAYING FOR YOUR POST-SECONDARY

GOVERNMENT GRANTS & LOANS: Student grants and loans are granted based on financial need. While you don't have to pay back any grants received, loans must be paid back. **Repayment** begins upon completion of studies. Financial institutions also have student banking packages that include borrowing for educational purposes. - ✓ Use the Student Aid Estimator to calculate if you are eligible for government support.
- Canada Student Loan Program: Start applying in early June (year of grad): https://www.canada.ca/en/services/benefits/education/student-aid.html
- ✓ BC residents can apply online at www.studentaidbc.ca.

SCHOLARSHIPS: These can be based on personal merit, academic achievement, extracurricular activities, athletic abilities, ethnic background, or any combination of these aspects. **Scholarships do not have to be repaid.**

- **Provincial scholarships** are administered by the government.
- Entrance scholarships are given to high school students entering a post-secondary school for the first time.
 - Automatic Entrance Scholarships (Students are automatically considered based on their grade average. No application required.)
 - Major Entrance Scholarships (Separate application required; usually awarded to students achieving high academic achievements throughout Grade 11 and 12 in addition to extra-curricular activities.)
- External scholarships are administered by an individual, business, organization, or trade union.
- **Local scholarships** are for students from a small defined area, e.g., you are not competing with students from across the country or province for the scholarship/ bursary. ** Learn more about local scholarships specifically for Best students at the <u>next scholarship meeting</u>, February 12, 2025. Mark your calendar now!

BURSARIES: Bursaries are non-repayable grants made to students in need of financial assistance. Evidence of need may be required. Other criteria may be set by the donor, i.e. community involvement/ leadership. Most post-secondary institutions have designated Undergraduate Entrance Bursaries for students in financial need.

AWARDS: Awards recognize skill or accomplishment and may or may not be monetary.

SCHOLARSHIPS TIPS

- **Get motivated.** Searching for and applying for scholarships requires work and effort, BUT the cost of tuition and fees per year averages between \$3,500 (some colleges) to \$7,500+ (UBC). Costs may be significantly higher for specialized programs, i.e. Engineering, Business, Musical Theatre, and out-of-province institutions. Books, meals, and housing will be extra. If you don't have lots of money sitting around, your options are taking out a loan, working extended hours, or finding scholarships.
- **Get organized.** Set aside some time every week to work on scholarships. Start a checklist and a folder where you keep track of scholarships you want to apply to, deadlines, references, etc.
- Start with yourself.
 - Evaluate opportunities based on your neighbourhood, ethnic background, personal situation: There are scholarships for students living in a certain community, scholarships for students of colour, scholarships based on cultural backgrounds (i.e., Iranian, or Korean heritage), scholarships for Indigenous students, financial aid for students who lost a parent, grew up in foster care or are dealing with disabilities or chronic illnesses. There are also scholarships for pursuing post-secondary studies in French!!
 - ➤ Evaluate your activities: Check out any organizations you are involved with for scholarships (your work, sports organizations, volunteering, Girl Guides, Cadets, church, your interest in STEM | Arts | Environmental Issues | Public Affairs, etc.)
- Become familiar with the financial aid page of the school(s) to which you intend to apply. Put the university's/ college's name into the search engine + "undergrad" + "financial aid" to find the page for that school. Here are some local sites to get you started:

 - Some universities require students to complete "awards-profiles" instead of submitting separate applications.
- Branch out to your family's involvements.
 - Parents'/ guardian's/ grandparent's place of work, union, or any religious or ethnic organizations your family may belong to, neighbourhood associations, insurances, credit unions, etc.
- Talk to people you know: Ms. Kaufmann, your counselor, teachers, family friends.
- Read the Charles Best Informer daily.
- Check the Career Centre pages on the school's website: Career Center is under *Programs and Services*, then hit the *Financial Aid* button to navigate to that page.
- Do some online research.

- **Complete a brag sheet** (download here). It helps you see your activities and accomplishments more clearly, and teachers/ supervisors may ask for it when you request a reference letter.
- References: You will need 2-3. Approach your referees early and discuss the possibility of them writing you a reference letter. Give them plenty of notice. Always provide referees with details. What kind of scholarships are you applying for? What are the criteria?

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION - PROVINCIAL SCHOLARSHIPS

BC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIPS

Awarded to 55 well-rounded high school graduates who have demonstrated service and leadership, both at school and in their communities, and who show aptitude for and commitment to their chosen career paths. The awarded \$5,000 scholarship voucher can be used for tuition at a designated post-secondary institution or B.C. authorized trades training provider. You must be nominated by the school to apply (only one student/ school). Check the Career Centre website later this Fall to find this year's BC Excellence brag sheet. Submit the brag sheet to Ms Kaufmann by Monday, December 9th, 2024, 9 am. We will let the nominated student know after Winter Break. The application deadline is in February.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Meet basic eligibility requirements

- Be eligible for a B.C. Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma); fulfill the requirements of the B.C.
 Graduation Program.
- Be graduating (between September 1 and August 31) during the same year the scholarship is awarded.
- Have at least a
 - Minimum "B" average in grades 11 and 12 courses required for graduation
 - Minimum "B" (73% or above) in Language Arts 12
 - Minimum "B" average, no more than one "C+" (67% or above), and no marks lower than "C+" in courses that fulfill graduation requirements for Science 11 or 12, Math 11, and Social Studies 11 or 12

PATHWAY TO TEACHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship is awarded to **20 outstanding high school graduates who have demonstrated commitment and aptitude for a career path in K-12 teaching**. Winners receive a \$5,000 scholarship voucher to redeem when they are registered and attending an approved K-12 teacher education program at one of BC's nine Faculties of Education. Deadline is usually February 15, tba. <u>Sample Application</u> **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA** are the same as for the BC Excellence Scholarships, see above. *You may apply for the Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship and the BC Excellence Scholarship, but you can't win both.*

BC ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

BC Achievement Scholarships are recognizing **the top 8,000 graduates in the province.** The Ministry will determine recipients based on achievement in Grades 10, 11, and 12 courses that satisfy B.C. Graduation Program requirements, including elective courses. A cumulative average percentage will be calculated and form the basis for determining winners who receive a \$1,250 scholarship voucher to use towards their post-secondary tuition. **Students do not apply for this scholarship (automatically awarded).**

DISTRICT/AUTHORITY AWARDS

There are 5,500 District/Authority Awards (DAA) distributed across school districts and independent school authorities. They recognize graduating B.C. students for excellence in their chosen area of interest or strength. Winners receive a \$1,250 scholarship voucher to use towards their post-secondary tuition. Students who win these awards will receive their voucher in the fall after graduation. *Information hasn't been updated yet for 2025, but last year our school was able to give away 40 (!!) District Authority Awards.

You must meet criteria determined by the school's scholarship committee. Submit the Best Internal Scholarship Package to apply for a DAA. Students are required to show outstanding achievement in one or more areas:

Areas of Achievement and Examples

Indigenous Languages and Culture	Demonstrated at school or in the community
Fine Arts	Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music
Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies	Demonstrated achievement in <i>multiple</i> ADST courses: Business, Technology, Home Economics (Foods, Textiles), Information Technology
Physical Activity	Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics, not limited to Physical Education
International Languages	International Languages Curriculum or External Assessments, including AP and IB courses
Community Service (Volunteer Activity; +150 hours)	Includes awareness of local, global, and cultural issues
Technical and Trades Training	Automotive, Robotics, Coding, Woodwork, Culinary Arts

YOUTH WORK IN TRADES \$1000 AWARD

Students who already have a paid job in trades and complete coursework online through Coquitlam Open Learning can potentially receive a \$1,000 award that can be used towards trades training (or potentially for tools). ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS/ UNIVERSITY SPECIFIC FINANCIAL AID PROGRAMS

There are **automatic entrance scholarships** (based on grade average, no application is required), **major entrance awards** (application is required), and sometimes **faculty specific entrance awards** (separate application). Major awards are awarded to students with a high academic average who have been actively involved in their community. Post-Secondary institutions also offer bursaries for applicants with demonstrated financial need. Sometimes there are separate applications, sometimes you must complete a general awards profile (usually available through the applicant's portal).

Attend as many university information sessions/post-secondary events as you can. Recruiters can provide a wealth of information – if you ask the right questions. Some post-secondary webinars are specifically focusing on financial aid. Become familiar with the **school's financial aid page**, deadlines vary.

You can also check your post-secondary school's website to see if they have info sessions scheduled.

- For BC: EducationPlannerBC is an invaluable source of information. You will use this to apply for all post-secondary institutions in BC, but there are also Financial Aid tips (with links). Make yourself familiar with the website: https://www.educationplannerbc.ca/go/plan/financial-resources
- **For Ontario:** Apply early through <u>OUAC</u> to allow sufficient time to apply for financial aid offered by the schools you are applying to. You will need your student applicant account to be activated before you can start applying for entrance scholarships and bursaries. http://www.ouac.on.ca
- American Universities and Colleges:
 - If you haven't already, plan to write the SAT exam asap; visit https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/sat/test-center-search.
 - While many U.S. schools are currently still "test-optional", SAT results are often required if the applicant wants to be considered for entrance awards. Carefully read through the individual school's website before deciding NOT to take the SAT.
 - Check the admission requirements of the school you plan to attend—they vary widely between schools!

OCTOBER

U of T LESTER B. PEARSON INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP - Recognizing international students who demonstrate exceptional academic achievement and creativity and who are recognized as leaders within their school. It covers tuition, books, incidental fees, and full residence support for four years. School nomination required. Submit your brag sheet by Sun, October 6 to skaufmann@sd43.bc.ca. More info.

LORAN AWARD - Tenable at 25 partner universities, the Loran Award is valued at \$100,000 over four years, including mentorship, funding for summer internships and participation in an extensive network of past and present scholars. In addition to the 36 Loran Awards, up to 124 finalist and provincial & territorial awards (\$5,000 or \$2,000 each, respectively) are awarded to promising candidates. The Loran Award is not a reward for past achievements, but an investment in a young person's potential future path of high impact. Criteria are force of character, service, and leadership potential. Must have minimum cumulative average of 85%. Open to Canadian citizens and permanent residents only. Deadline is October 15, 2024, before 5pm Pacific Time. https://loranscholar.ca/becoming-a-scholar/

DR. M. WOSK ENVIRONMENTAL LEADERSHIP AWARD - Eligible participants must have an interest in ecological issues and environmental preservation as well as the organizational and communication skills necessary to make a profound difference. Open to students aged 15-19 currently residing in the Metro Vancouver area. Value: up to \$1,000. UBC INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM – Open to high academic achievers who have demonstrated exceptional extracurricular activities, show a desire to create global change, and are dedicated to giving back to their schools and communities. 50 need-based scholarships are available. Must be an international student with financial need, nominated by the school. Submit your brag sheet by October 14 to skaufmann@sd43.bc.ca. International Scholars - UBC | Undergraduate Programs and Admissions

NOVEMBER

QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY CHANCELLOR'S SCHOLARSHIP AWARD – We can nominate 2 students. Find the special Queen's brag sheet on the Career Centre website, due back to Ms. Kaufmann by November 11. Must have 90% + average, plan to attend Queen's University, creative and original thinking, proven leadership qualities. Apply for admission to Queen's via the Ontario Universities Application Centre (OUAC) before November 20 to ensure that you gain access to SOLUS to submit your scholarship application by December 8. TD CANADA TRUST SCHOLARSHIPS FOR COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP - Twenty TD Scholarships for Community Leadership are awarded to students in their last year of high school who have demonstrated leadership in improving their community: Students who are helping to support change, nurture progress and demonstrated consistent and outstanding dedication to solving a community problem or making their community a better place. Grade average 75%+. Each scholarship has a value of up to \$70,000, incl. tuition and living expenses for up to four years. Deadline is November 13, 2024, before 9 pm. www.tdcanadatrust.com/scholarship

DECEMBER

UBC PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLARS AWARD - Most prestigious awards available to students entering UBC. One-time awards of \$5,000, and renewable awards of up to \$40,000 on the Okanagan campus, and \$80,000 on the Vancouver campus (over four years). For students who excel across the board (93%+) and who have demonstrated academic and leadership achievements in the arts, community, athletics, and school. Must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents. Apply to UBC by December 1. On the application for admission, they ask whether you want to apply for this scholarship (short essay why you should be considered for the award). https://you.ubc.ca/financial-planning/scholarships-awards-canadian-students/presidential-scholars/

UBC CENTENNIAL SCHOLARS ENTRANCE AWARD – For students who demonstrated academic excellence but have financial need. Up to \$80,000. Apply to UBC by December 1. You and your family must complete a separate application to demonstrate financial need. The application also requires a reference from someone who is well acquainted with you and who can comment on your character, interest in UBC, and financial situation. https://you.ubc.ca/financial-planning/scholarships-awards-canadian-students/entrance-award/

UBC BEYOND TOMORROW SCHOLARSHIP - Assisting Black Canadian students who are transitioning to UBC, incl. a variety of one-time and renewable awards of up to \$80,000. Must self-identify as Black (African, African American, African Canadian, Afro-Caribbean), strong academic student with financial need, meeting all UBC admissions requirements. Canadian citizens, permanent resident, or protected person. Apply to UBC by December 1. https://you.ubc.ca/financial-planning/scholarships-awards-canadian-students/beyond-tomorrow/

SFU UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARS ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS- SFU recognizes high school students who demonstrate excellence in both their academic and extracurricular activities and who demonstrate potential to enrich the university community through ongoing academic and community contributions. Scholarships are available to domestic and international high school students admitted for the fall term to an undergraduate degree in any faculty. Up to \$40,000 over 4 years. Minimum Requirement: 90%+ academic average. Separate application required, due December 15. Apply to SFU early to gain access to the scholarship application. https://www.sfu.ca/students/financialaid/entrance/highschool.html

UNIVERSITY OF CALGARY PRESTIGE AWARDS - All Prestige Awards are renewable. Must be Canadian citizen or Permanent Resident. Apply to UCalgary early and submit application for the Prestige Awards by December 1, 2024. Multiple Prestige Awards available, \$15,000 - \$25,000.

BEEDIE LUMINARIES - This scholarship program provides access to BC public universities, colleges and trade schools and enables promising Grade 12 BC students to achieve their dreams. 100+ scholarships awarded (up to \$44,000 per student / 4-year undergraduate degree, \$22,000 per student / 2-year college or trade-school diploma, mentorship, Summer paid internships). Must demonstrate financial need; grade average 75%+, educational goals, academic readiness, proven work ethic, grit and resilience in the face of adversity, community and home contributions and/or extracurricular activities. Application opens in November, deadline is December 16, 2024. https://beedieluminaries.ca/grade-12-scholarship/

BURGER KING SCHOLARS PROGRAM – There's an employee's track and a general track which is open to all graduating high school students in the U.S., Canada and Puerto Rico. Must have a cumulative high school grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale, or the equivalent. Must plan to enroll full-time for the entire year following graduation at an accredited two- or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school in the U.S., Canada, or Puerto Rico. Deadline is December 16, 2024. Burger King Scholars (burgerkingfoundation.org)

TERRY FOX HUMANITARIAN AWARD - Open to graduating students who have been involved in voluntary humanitarian activities. Must be in good academic standing; planning to pursue their first university degree or diploma at a Canadian post-secondary institution in the upcoming academic year. Valued at \$28,000 over 4 years. Canadian citizens or PR. Deadline is December 1, 2024. https://terryfoxawards.ca/apply/

CMOLIK SCHOLARSHIPS - Awarded to youth who have faced adversity in their lives and demonstrated tenacity. Up to \$40,000 for books/tuition for an undergraduate degree or equivalent. Transportation and living costs are not eligible. Must be Canadian or PR, lived in Canada for 7+ years. Top grades through high school are not required, but must be capable of succeeding at the post-secondary level. Criteria are proven resilience in the face of adversity, positive work ethic, contributions to their community, clarity of their educational goals, focused commitment. Nomination required, one student/school. Submit the special Cmolik brag sheet (posted later in the Fall) to Ms. Kaufmann by December 9th, 2024. https://thecmolikfoundation.com/undergraduate/

BC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP - Awarded to 55 well-rounded high school graduates who have demonstrated service and leadership, both at school and in their communities, and who show aptitude for and commitment to their chosen career paths. Valued at \$5,000. **Each school can nominate 1 student**. Submit the special BC Excellence brag sheet (will be posted to Career Centre site > Financial Aid section) to Ms Kaufmann by Mon, December 9th, 2024.

UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN ONTARIO NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM — National Scholarships are designed to recognize all-round excellence. Based on outstanding academic performance, demonstrated ability for creative and innovative thought and a passion for the pursuit of learning. Recognizing exceptional achievement in extracurricular activities such as the arts and athletics / commitment to community service through ongoing contributions to school and community life. Must be nominated by the school (up to 4 students/school plus 1 international student). If you want to be considered for nomination, submit a special Western brag sheet to Ms Kaufmann by Monday, December 16. JANUARY

SCHULICH LEADER SCHOLARSHIPS - Canada's most coveted undergraduate STEM scholarships. Up to one hundred are awarded to entrepreneurial-minded high school graduates enrolling in a Science, Technology, Engineering or Math program at 20 partner universities across Canada. Half are valued at \$100,000 for engineering scholarships and half are valued at \$80,000 for science and math scholarships. Every high school in Canada can nominate one student. Based on academic excellence, leadership, creativity. Canadian citizen or permanent resident. If you want to be considered for **nomination** submit your Schulich brag sheet (posted later this Fall) to Ms Kaufmann by on January 6, 2025. https://www.schulichleaders.com/apply?section=student

UNIVERSITY OF ALBERTA SCHOLARSHIPS - There are admission-based scholarships for domestic and international students which do not require a separate application (based on your high school grade average), and application-based scholarships. Fill out a single scholarship application and, based on your background, experiences, academics, and interests; they will assess you for a match. Deadline: January 10, 2025 (apply early to U of A to gain access) Entrance Scholarships | Undergraduate Admissions + Programs (ualberta.ca)

UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO SCHOLARS PROGRAM – At U of T, students are automatically considered for a variety of admission awards when they apply to the University. There are also admission awards that require students to complete a separate application or awards profile. Apply to U of T early to get access to their awards profile and complete all required steps by January 31.

CANADIAN WOMEN IN MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIP - One award of \$1,000 available for a female B.C. student enrolled in any year of study in secondary school who has been contributing to their school's leadership team or student council. TRI-CITIES SOROPTIMISTS - BEA KELLY SOROPTIMIST AWARD — Acknowledging young women in Grade 12 who demonstrate that they make a difference in their community and/or school. Multiple awards at \$1,000 each. Current Grade 12 female student planning to attend an accredited post-secondary institution after graduation, lives or attends school in the Tri-Cities area. TRI-CITIES SOROPTIMISTS: SPREAD YOUR WINGS AWARD – \$1,000 to support female immigrants or refugees who have arrived in BC in the last 5 years. You must be enrolled in or planning to attend a vocational/skills training program or undergraduate degree program. Deadline is January 15.

UNIVERSITY OF GUELPH TOP SCHOLARSHIPS

10 of Canada's best and brightest future leaders are awarded one of U of G's top scholarships! Worth \$42,000 each (and incl. a research assistantship position), these scholarships recognize academic excellence and leadership. Applicants have grades above 90% and made significant leadership contributions to their school or community. One award is reserved for the top international student (Dr. Franco J. Vaccarino President's Scholarship). Deadline is January 27, 2025. https://admission.uoguelph.ca/topscholarships

DB PERKS & LIFESAVING SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIPS - The DB Perks Scholarship aims to support and assist Lifesaving Society lifeguards and instructors trained and working in BC & Yukon who are pursuing post-secondary education. 3x \$1,000 available. Criteria: Satisfactory achievement in the areas of Trades or Fine & Performing Arts (based on courses taken in a graduation program), one page essay outlining why you want to pursue a career in Trades or Fine Arts. Financial need will be considered. Last year's deadline was June 1; check back to the Career Centre team/ website in the early Spring.

CONFRATELLANZA ITALO-CANADESE SCHOLARSHIP - Open to all students of Italian origin (i.e. as having at least one parent or grandparent of direct Italian descent) with an academic standing sufficient to qualify for entry into the post-secondary institution of their choice. RETAIL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM – Applicants must be currently enrolled full-time or part-time at a Canadian college or university for fall entry (Letter of Acceptance is sufficient as proof.) to pursue retail, business, fashion, marketing or any other retail related post-secondary program. Must be currently working part-time or full-time within the retail industry. Various scholarships ranging from \$1,000-\$3,000 are available. The deadline was previously in June. CARLETON UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE AWARDS - If admitted to Carleton with an admissions average of 80 percent or better, you will automatically be considered for a renewable entrance scholarship (\$1,000 to \$4,000 for up to 4 years). To be considered for an entrance scholarship, the University's Admissions Services must receive your complete application for admission and all required grades (either directly or through the Ontario Universities Application Centre) by June 15. Entrance scholarship offers are not assessed or reassessed on final high school grades. https://carleton.ca/awards/awards/

BOB CLARKE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - The scholarship provides up to \$2,000 towards tools or post-secondary education tuition leading to a career in the automotive industry and is awarded annually. To be eligible, applicants must have completed a secondary school automotive, ACE-IT or Foundation program by the end of the current school year. We are looking for those who have demonstrated a genuine interest in pursuing a career in the automotive trades and plan to enroll in a Red Seal apprenticeship. Must demonstrate financial need (\$100,000 or less annual net income per family is required) and demonstrate perseverance in overcoming adversity. TED ROGERS ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS - The Ted Rogers Entrance Scholarship is aimed at students entering school, full-time to pursue a first bachelor's degree or first diploma program or first trades program at a Canadian university, college, or trades school to help close the gap between tuition and additional fees. Six hundred scholarships at \$1,000 each are available! Evaluation is based on academic performance, but preference may be given to students from equity-deserving groups. It's very easy to apply, so apply anyway!
