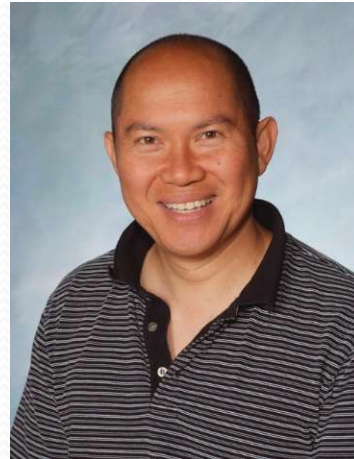

# Numeracy and Literacy Assessments

- All students are required to take the Numeracy and Literacy Assessments in order to graduate
- Can be written anytime between Grade 10 and 12
- Not tied to a specific course
- Students are scheduled to take the Numeracy and Literacy Assessments in Grade 10, and the Literacy (and French Literacy) in Grade 12.
- May be taken up to 3 times
- Results will be reported using a 4-category proficiency scale and will appear on your transcript as a number, representing one of the four categories (emerging-developing-proficient-extending).



# B.C. Achievement Scholarships:

## \$1250

- The Ministry of Education determines recipients
- Based on students' achievement in Grade 10, 11, and 12 courses that satisfy graduation program requirements.
- Includes elective courses.
- Based on a cumulative average percentage
- Recipients must receive a “B” or greater in English 12, Francais 12, or Communications 12.
- Rank among the top 3000 students in B.C.

- 80 % or higher
- 70 % to 79 %

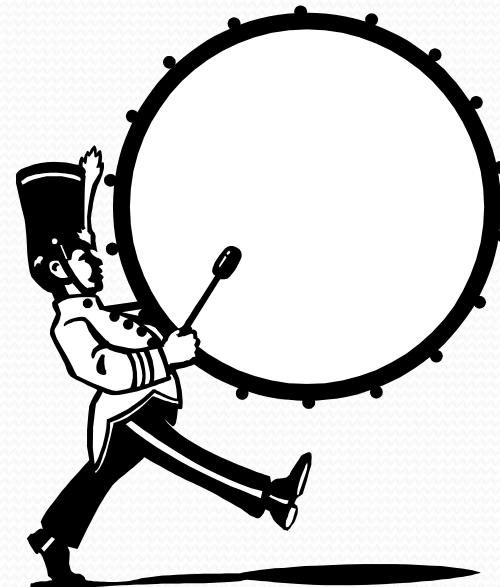

# ***Advanced Placement***

- AP exams are available for students who are excelling in a certain subject
- After finishing the Grade 12 level of the course, students can write the AP Exam for that subject.
- If students get over Level 3, they can get credit for the first year university level of that course





# *External Course Credit*

- Credit may be given for coursework taken outside of the school system.
- Examples: Music, Languages, First Aid, Sports (provincial/national level), Cadets, Driver Education, Dance, Scouts, Guides

# UBC Admission Requirements

- Based on 12 to 18 courses including at least 6 Grade 12 courses (not all have to be approved)
- All academic grade 11 and 12 courses count
- Course choice should match program applied for
- Lowest course omitted (as long as it is not a degree specific requirement)
- Faculty specific requirements still remain
- Breadth, rigor and relevancy in course choice is important
- Holistic admission using Personal Profile, Faculty Requirements and Grade 11 and 12 courses.
- On-Line courses must be completed by **June 31<sup>st</sup>** (we recommend completion by **April 30<sup>th</sup>**)



# SFU Admission Requirements

- English 12 with a minimum final blended grade of 70%
- Minimum of 5 **Grade 12** approved courses (including English 12)
- Admission evaluation based on all approved **Grade 11** and 12 courses with greater emphasis on List A courses
- **Admission Compass**
- On-line courses must be completed by **June 31<sup>st</sup>** (**we recommend completion by April 30<sup>th</sup>**)

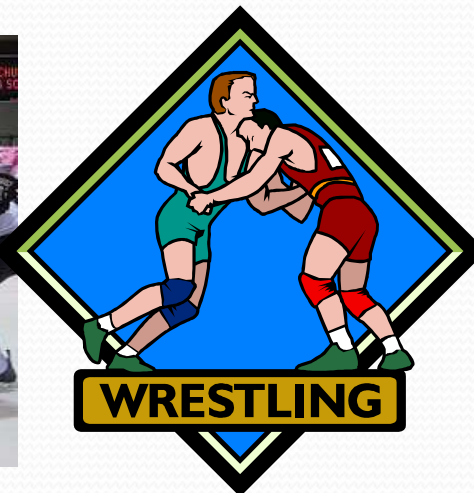
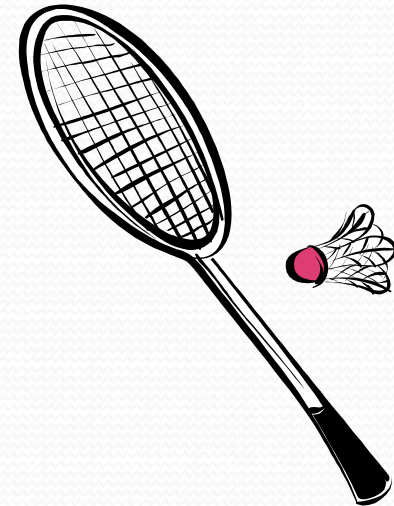

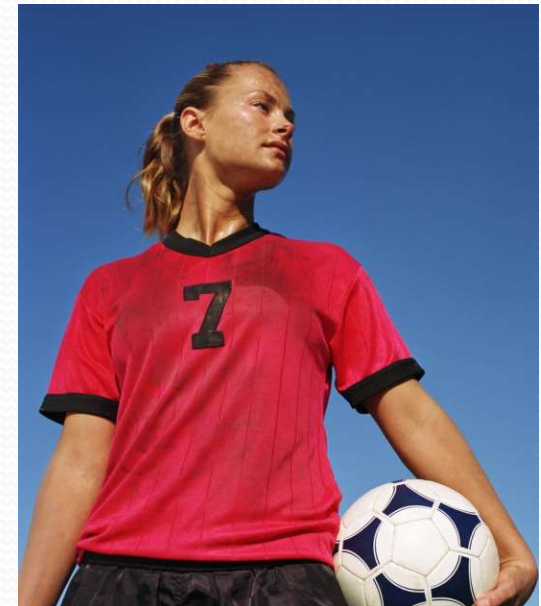
