## Numeracy and Literacy Assessments

- All students are required to take the Numeracy and Literacy Assessments in order to graduate
- Can be written anytime between Grade 10 and 12
- Not tied to a specific course
- Students are scheduled to take the Numeracy and Literacy Assessments in Grade 10, and the Literacy (and French Literacy) in Grade 12.
- May be taken up to 3 times
- Results will be reported using a 4 category proficiency scale and will appear on your transcript as a number, representing one of the four categories (emerging-developing-proficient-extending).


## B.C. Achievement Scholarships:

- The Ministry of Education determines recipients
- Based on students' achievement in Grade 10, 11, and 12 courses that satisfy graduation program requirements.
- Includes elective courses, but not GT.
- Based on a cumulative average percentage

- Recipients must receive a " $B$ " or greater in English 12, Francais 12, or Communications 12.
- Rank among the top 3000 students in B.C.

## Math Course Recomendations

| Course | Difficulty level <br> (compared <br> to Foundations 10) | Student Workload |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| Workplace 11 | A little easier | Expect about 30 minutes a week outside of <br> class |
| Foundations 11 | About the same as <br> Foundations 10 | Expect about $\mathbf{2 0}$ minutes a day outside of class |
| Pre-Calculus 11 | Quite difficult | Expect about 45 minutes a day outside of class |
| Foundations 12 | Similar to Foundations 11 | Expect about 30 minutes a day outside of class |
| Statistics 12 | Quite difficult | Expect about 45 minutes a day outside of class |
| Pre-Calculus 12 | A level up from Pre- <br> Calculus 11 | Expect about 1 hour a day outside of class |
| Calculus 12 | Very difficult | Expect about $1+$ hour a day outside of class |

## Math Pathways

It is recommended that if in Foundations of Mathematics and Pre-calculus 10 a student is achieving:

- 80 \% or higher
- 70 \% to $79 \%$
- 60\% to 70 \%
- $50 \%$ to $60 \%$

## Advanced Placement

- AP exams are available for students who are excelling in a certain subject
- After finishing the Grade 12 level of the course, students can write the AP Exam for that subject.
- If students get over Level 3, they can get credit for the first year university level of that course
- NEW: AP Chemistry will combine the regular course with the AP course
- French, Psychology, Chemistry, Calculus

## UBC Admission Requirements

- Based on 12 to 18 courses including at least 6 Grade 12 courses (not all have to be approved)
- All grade 11 and 12 courses count
- Course choice should match program applied for
- Lowest course omitted (as long as it is not a degree specific requirement)
- Faculty specific requirements still remain
- Breath, rigor and relevancy in course choice is important
- Holistic admission using Personal Profile, Faculty Requirements and Grade 11 and 12 courses.
- On-Line courses must be completed by February ${ }^{\text {st }}$ (to be confirmed)


## SFU Admission Requirements
