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















Counsellor's Corner

Dear River Community Families,

As we approach the holiday break, we're excited to share all the wonderful activities that have taken place in divisions 16, 17, and 18 this month. It's been a busy, creative, and festive time of learning and celebration!

To celebrate the end of National Novel Writing Month (NaNoWriMo), we hosted a Thank Goodness It's Over (TGIO) party with the entire River Community. It was a fantastic time to enjoy some well-deserved snacks and celebrate our hard work. All three classes have also started discussions on safety in Outdoor Education. We've been teaching students the essential skills for exploring nature, emphasizing the importance of being prepared and staying safe in the great outdoors.

Divisions 16 and 17:

In Language Arts, we finished studying literary devices in Harry Potter, exploring themes like symbolism, foreshadowing, and metaphors. To show our artistic sides and holiday spirit, students wrapped up their study of Harry Potter by incorporating elements from the novel into a fun holiday door decorating activity. PERO brought color to the classroom with a line art project using the contrast of warm and cool colors.

In Science, we began an exciting new unit on the human body, studying systems like the excretory system, reproductive system, nervous system, and endocrine/ hormonal system. This unit will continue in the new year and allow opportunities for individual research. Our Social Studies focus this month has been on climate and extreme environments. We've begun to explore how different climates impact the people who live there.


Division 18:

In Science, we've dived into the fascinating world of chemistry. Students have explored solutions by creating crystallized Christmas ornaments and rock candy. They've investigated chemical and physical changes through hands-on experiments, studied mass and volume relationships, and solved a density mystery lab, identifying unknown items using density and qualitative properties. In another activity, students analyzed mystery powders, identifying substances through their physical and chemical reactions—engaging curiosity and scientific inquiry.





In Math, we've been working with fractions and developing complex challenge board questions to deepen understanding and problem-solving skills. In Social Studies, we've begun our exploration of Law and Governance with the valuable guidance of an Indigenous Knowledge Keeper, enriching our understanding of governance systems through diverse perspectives.



Finally, our students are busily preparing their applications to programs of choice, honing their academic writing skills to craft compelling essays and submissions.

Looking ahead, we are excited for more hands-on learning and creative projects as we head into the new year. Thank you for your continued support. Wishing you all a joyful and restful holiday season!
