Federal Gov'T predicting immigration up 500,000 people this year and many will be settling in major cities such as our area. Question was asked whether there would be more schools built to accommodate. Answer was they always petition the Provincial Government based on needs.

Be careful with kids wanting to be attracted by trends (many want to be Youtubers). They can have dreams/lofty goals but also need to be realistic. Start resume early (in middle school). Keep adding to it. Take advantage of all high schools have available (clubs, volunteering, etc). Much more important to be well rounded (not just academics)

Digital portfolio of experiences is a great way to present what you have done with visuals and a fun way for kids to record what they have done.

The jobs that our kids will have may not exist yet, that is why it is critical that kids will be more well rounded so they can be prepared for the opportunities in the future.
