We are so incredibly proud to celebrate Oliver Soh, grade 6 student in Division 5, for his bronze in the Queen's Commonwealth Essay Competition. There were thousands and thousands of entries making his achievement even more spectacular.

His topic was: Voyages – Describe a sea voyage between Commonwealth nations, focusing on sights and encounters.

Here is his first paragraph of his submission:

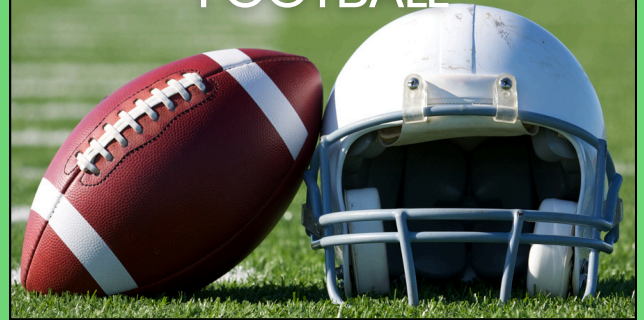

2026 Student Learning Survey

The Student Learning Survey is for students in grade 4, 7, 10, 11, and 12, their parents, staff and administrators. It is an annual survey that gathers feedback from students, parent and staff in public schools to assess educational experiences and improve school environments.

The Student Learning Survey aims to collect insights on various aspects of the educational experience, including:

- **Curriculum Implementation:** Feedback on how well the curriculum changes are being integrated into classrooms.
- **Learning Environment:** Assessing the safety, inclusivity, and overall atmosphere of the school.
- **Student Wellness and Satisfaction:** Understanding how students feel about their school experience and their emotional well-being.
- **Engagement and Belonging:** Evaluating how connected students feel to their school community and their level of engagement in learning activities.

While Grade 7 students have completed this survey at school, we ask that parents/guardians complete this survey by clicking on this link:

CROSS CATCHMENT APPLICATIONS

Parents sometimes wish for their children to attend a school that is not their catchment school.

School District 43 uses a random draw process for Cross Catchment Applications (using in-district priority, then out-of-district).

If enrollment projections show that space is available, Cross Catchment transfer applications will be accepted in accordance with the following priorities:

1. sibling of a child who will be in attendance at the Cross Catchment school in the following year;
2. a child residing within the SD43 residential boundaries (could include private or homeschool); and
3. non-school district resident child.

For schools with capacity issues, the district may use grade and program-specific placements as well as one-to-one school placements to accommodate student movement in the process.

The **School Locator Tool** provides a student's designated catchment area schools. Catchment is based on permanent home address. Student address must correspond to the address in the school's record system.

Cross Catchment applications for September 2026 (School Year 2026–27) opens at 9:00 am February 6, 2026 and closes February 11, 2026 at 4:00 pm. The link will be available on the front page of our website at www.sd43.bc.ca.

Parents/guardians will receive an email about the application results during the first week of March. Schools will contact successful applicants shortly after.

(if you have been accepted to a Program of Choice, please register at the school indicated on your acceptance letter)
- 2** Download and Complete our New Student Registration Form found below.
- 3** Prepare required verification documents.
- 4** Email the school your registration form and required verification documents on the posted registration dates
(School email can be found at the bottom section of the school's website or on the school locator on our website)
- 5** Wait for a confirmation email and next steps from the school.



WINTER WEATHER AHEAD

School Closures Due to Inclement Weather

All schools in School District No. 43 (Coquitlam) will remain OPEN, if at all possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

Any district-wide or partial-district closures will be decided and communicated by 6:30 a.m. via the SD43 website at www.sd43.bc.ca and other sources so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements.

In most instances, announcements will NOT be made that schools are open; only cancellations, closures or delayed school openings will be announced.

While the District tries to make the best decision with the information available, the weather does change quickly. Therefore, when schools remain open, decisions to stay at home during challenging weather conditions should be made by each family.

Where to look for information during an emergency or inclement weather.

1. The SD43 HOME PAGE is the official primary source of SD43 information. Always check here first.
 - Look for a STATUS BANNER at www.sd43.bc.ca (example shown below).
 - Click its main title to learn more.
2. Information may also be announced on secondary sources: (Caution: this info may not be current)
 - @SD43 social media channels, including Facebook and Instagram.
 - Local radio and TV news outlets.
3. Other options include:
 - Use your mobile phone to access one of the above sources if you have no power.
 - Call or text a friend who has access to one of the above sources if you have no internet.
 - Use your home phone to call a friend who has access to the above sources.
 - Call your school for a status update.

This is for security purposes and we suggest you have your passwords written down somewhere safe to refer to! If you can't remember your password, you can request for a Password Reset when logging in (see below).
