Science classes are learning about different body systems such as respiration and circulation and I have seen a number of very well done assignments highlighting the students' learning of these scientific processes. Our swim team and cross country teams did very well in the district meets and made us all proud. Special kudos to Bilisuma who won the Grade 6 District-wide gold medal in crosscountry. Volleyball games are still underway with some final district playoffs coming soon for Grades 7 and 8, with Grade 6 happening today.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE



The morning bell rings at 8:35 a.m. Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday and at 8:55 a.m. on Wednesdays. Students are expected to arrive to school on time, giving them the opportunity to prepare for learning (getting their materials organized, removing outdoor wear, going to lockers, etc.). When students arrive late for school, not only is the classroom disrupted, but also the student misses out on receiving important classroom instruction and information shared from our morning announcements.

KATESLEM AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

STEAM Projects Kick Off at Como!

We are thrilled to announce the start of our school-wide STEAM projects! This year, our students will have the opportunity to dive into three different STEAM projects, each spanning 10 Thursdays for 2 hours. These projects are designed to ignite creativity, foster collaboration, and enhance critical thinking skills.

Project Highlight: Carnival Games 🎡

One of the projects this year is Carnival Games. In this project, students will work in small groups to design, build, and host their very own carnival games. This project connects to real-world issues by allowing students to explore the concepts of physics, engineering, and mathematics in a fun and interactive way. Students will learn about the mechanics behind carnival games, such as probability, force, and motion, while also considering the social aspects of hosting an event. They will understand how events like carnivals can bring communities together, fostering social interaction and engagement.

But that's not all! This project is packed with opportunities to develop essential employability skills.

Teachers will act as employers, guiding students through the process of presenting the math and science concepts behind their games.

Business Management: Students will learn to manage their "business," ensuring they stay profitable by tracking costs (materials and labor) and analyzing the profitability of their games.

<u>Here's what our students will be doing:</u>

Design and Build: Students will brainstorm, plan, and construct their carnival games. Students will have the freedom to choose the type of game they want to build, which will allow them to express their creativity. They can decide on the game's theme, materials, and rules, as well as how they will present their game to their peers at the carnival. This choice will empower students and enhance their engagement in the project.

<u>Host a Carnival:</u> Once the games are ready, students will host a carnival for their peers and teachers. The final product will be a carnival game created by each group, which will be showcased at a school-wide carnival event. Additionally, students will prepare a presentation to explain the science and math behind their game, which they will share with attendees, making their learning visible to a broader audience.

This hands-on experience will not only be fun but also educational, helping students understand the real-world applications of math and science while developing teamwork and business skills.



Login TO MYED BC Portal

Access to the portal can be found <u>HERE</u>. It is best practice to go to our school website and click on "MyEdBC Family Portal" under "Quick Links." Avoid using google to search for MyEd BC because it often takes you to a different link and it won't work properly!

Your MyEd BC Login is 43-youremailaddress. Please note that every three months, the system requires you to create a new password. This is for security purposes and we suggest you have your passwords written down somewhere safe to refer to! If you can't remember your password, you can request for a Password Reset when logging in (see below).

Wishing endless joy, prosperity and warmth to your home and family this Diwali. Happy Diwali!




On <u>Monday, November 11</u>, we honour those who gave their lives to serve our country. School is closed on this day.


