## How to Order PHOTOS

Student pictures are now ready for viewing and ordering! Photo orders must be placed by **Sunday, October 13** to be included in the first delivery to school. Photo orders will be delivered to the school approximately one week after this date.

Scan the QR Code on the paper given to your child on photo day

### OR

**Step 1** - Go to [www.vibrantphotos.ca](http://www.vibrantphotos.ca)

**Step 2** - Enter your unique code provided on the paper given to your student on photo day

**Step 3** - View Images

**Step 4** - Select 'Buy Photo' and you will be able to select from a variety of packages, single photo sheets and bonus items. Select product that you want to purchase and then choose which image you want to add to the product.

**Step 6** - Add to cart. Select school delivery or choose ship to home (minimal shipping charge).



Students with photos taken on original photo day must sign up to be included in retake photo day. A \$5 sign up fee will be collected online and applied as a credit towards a future purchase. Students that missed the original photo day do NOT need to sign up.

## BY MR. BROWN

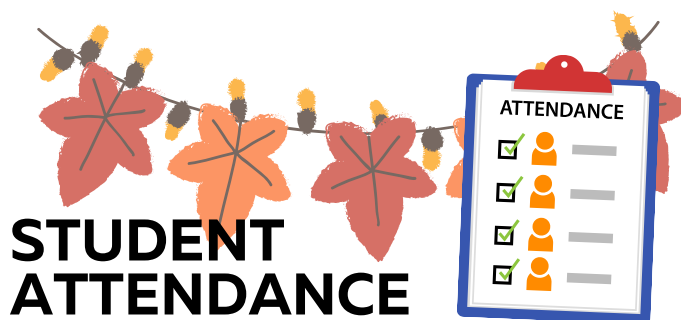

The morning bell rings at 8:35 a.m. Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday and at 8:55 a.m. on Wednesdays. Students are expected to arrive to school on time, giving them the opportunity to prepare for learning (getting their materials organized, removing outdoor wear, going to lockers, etc.). When students arrive late for school, not only is the classroom disrupted, but also the student misses out on receiving important classroom instruction and information shared from our morning announcements.

If your child needs to be dismissed early, we ask that you please inform the office ahead of time. Please make sure we have a time when your child is leaving school. We also ask that you please advise whether your child will be walking or will be picked up from the school for their safety. If you will be picking up your child and the office wasn't informed, please come into the office and we will call your child. Please note that your child will not be allowed to leave early until the office gets a verbal or written permission from a parent.

\*Reminder: please do not send your child to school if they are experiencing any symptoms of illness and only return when the major symptoms (fever, cough, etc.) subside.



# GRADE 6 IMMUNIZATIONS

## Consent package due: TUESDAY, OCTOBER 1

Immunization consent packages will be going home with the Grade 6 students today as prepared by Fraser Health.

Date #2: Friday, November 1, 2024

Date #3: Monday, May 5, 2025

Date #4: Tuesday, May 20, 2025

The medical information on the consent form is private and intended only for Fraser Health Nurse to view after collecting them. Therefore, please complete the consent form and **place it in a sealed envelope labelled with "SCHOOL NURSE"** and return it to the office on **Tuesday, October 1**. Fraser Health will be picking up these consent forms before the end of the day.

Please note, the school does **not** hold information on your child's immunization status. Any questions around your child's immunization or questions specific to the immunization program are to be directed to Public Health.

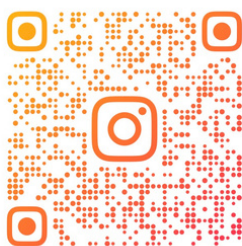

## GRADE 6 STAY ACTIVE PASS

The Tri Cities, in cooperation with School District 43, are pleased to once again offer the Grade 6 Stay Active! Program for all SD43 Grade 6 students. This program is to promote youth involvement in physical activity by providing 12 free admissions to either drop-in swimming, skating and gymnasium-based activities in the cities of Coquitlam, Port Moody and Port Coquitlam.

To receive a Grade 6 Stay Active! card, please bring the following documentation to one of the Coquitlam facilities:

- A letter of verification from School District #43 from the school's office, not a teacher, identifying the applicant as a Grade 6 student.
- Birth certificate or Care Card showing the student's age as of December 31, 2011.
- Proof of Coquitlam residency ie. Phone, Hydro, Cable, Gas bill or Property Tax Notice. Note: Driver's licence and PO Boxes are not acceptable.
- Your child - to have their picture taken

Bring the above documentation to one of the following locations:

- Poirier Sport & Leisure Complex - 633 Poirier Street
- City Centre Aquatic Complex - 1210 Pinetree Way
- Pinetree Community Centre - 1260 Pinetree Way

Remember to keep your cards safe. Replacement cards are available at a nominal fee of \$5. Passes must be presented to the cashier at the time of admission. Students without their passes will have to pay regular admission rates.

## Mountain Rider Program

The team at Como Lake are very proud of the amazing opportunities we are able to provide for our students through our partnership with Mt Seymour.

### **Here are this year's opportunities to get on the mountain:**

Students who wish to spend time on the mountain will be able to sign up for our Mountain Riders Program. The students who make it into this program will be on the mountain for four weeks of 2-hour small group lessons starting on **Thursday, January 9, 2025**. We will leave at lunch time and be back at the school between 7:40 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.

Students who sign up for Mountain Riders Lessons receive a free Value Pass from Mt Seymour! This allows students to ride any weekday for free.

Students with the four Mountain Rider Lessons in January AND with their own equipment (or a rental pass from Sports Junkies or another company) can then sign up for our Genius/Fun package. Thanks to the Value Pass, students in this program only need to pay for the bus costs. The Genius program runs for 6 weeks starting **Thursday, February 6, 2025**. Please note, Mt. Seymour will NOT be offering rentals for these 6 weeks, so students will need their own equipment, or can rent for the season from Sports Junkies or another company.

If you need to rent equipment to participate in all ten days, you can go to Sports Junkies clearance centre or a similar company and purchase a Rental Pass for the season from them. The school is not able to arrange rental passes for students.

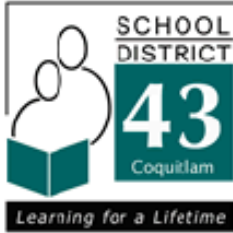
Our next meeting for the students is **Thursday October 3**, we will be sending home the paperwork for sign up day.

Mountain Riders **sign up** is happening the morning of **Wednesday, October 9, 2024**. Spots in the program are limited so it will be a first come first serve basis. We have a total of 150 spots, 90 skiing and 60 snowboarding. Staff will be here early to sign up the students. This process will start at 7:00 a.m. There is high demand and a real buzz around the school with students wanting to come early to sign up. Please do not allow your child to come before 6:30 a.m. There is no staff here to receive the students.

## INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS Foundation Skills Assessment

School District No. 43 (Coquitlam) will be conducting the Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA) in October and early November, in accordance with the School Act. The Foundation Skills Assessment measures literacy and numeracy skills in Grade 4 and Grade 7 as set out in provincial curricula and is only one source of the data that teachers and the district use to establish comprehensive evidence of student achievement in the Coquitlam School District.

The FSA continues to:

- assess literacy and numeracy
- contain both written and online components

It includes:

- a paper-based literacy task which includes a collaboration activity and three written response questions.
- an online literacy portion which includes thirty questions.
- a paper-based numeracy task which includes three written response questions and one self-reflection question.
- an online numeracy portion which includes thirty questions.
- a self-reflection component which includes one selected response question and one written response question.

The Foundation Skills Assessment does NOT measure any outcomes from the Grades 4 or 7 curricula. It is a cumulative review of outcomes taught in K – 3 or K – 6. As a provincially prescribed assessment, all Grade 4 and Grade 7 students are expected to participate in the FSA. There are specific exemptions identified by the Ministry regarding students who have previously written the FSA's at that grade level, some students with Individualized Education Programs (IEP's) and some students receiving English as an Additional Language (EAL) support.

A parent/guardian wishing to request that a student be excused from participating in the 2024 FSA can do so under the following exemptions as set out by the Ministry of Education:

- Family emergency
- Illness
- Extenuating circumstances

Please contact your school principal should you need to discuss this information as it pertains to your Grade 4 or Grade 7 child. For more information on the FSA, visit

## Login TO MYED BC Portal

Access to the portal can be found HERE. It is best practice to go to our school website and click on "MyEdBC Family Portal" under "Quick Links." Avoid using google to search for MyEd BC because it often takes you to a different link and it won't work properly!

Your MyEd BC Login is 43-youremailaddress. Please note that every three months, the system requires you to create a new password. This is for security purposes and we suggest you have your passwords written down somewhere safe to refer to! If you can't remember your password, you can request for a Password Reset when logging in (see below).
