


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**Option 1:** Estimated cost is \$615.99 CAD (\$549.99+Tax), Free shipping – pops 80 cups of popcorn per batch.

#### 10. New Business

- West Coast Seeds need to work out a timeframe, and decide weather we should go ahead with it or not. We went back and forth but landed on November 15<sup>th</sup> and February 15<sup>th</sup>
- PAC Wishlist item for fundraising Portable Planetarium.
  - For elementary schools, we provide up to 6 presentations/day (20-30 minutes)
  - A maximum of 30 students can be accommodated with each presentation, for elementary schools, a maximum of 180 students per day. This would mean that we would need two days.

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- One day of programming is \$585 per day plus mileage; travel time and accommodation, if applicable.
- This is something that could be supported by the gaming fund. We could try to do this in the new year, as early as February or March. We will have to coordinate this with David, and the school.
- We will bring this up with additional information in the December meeting, and vote on it then.
- Rise Arts After School programs. Is this something we can look into for doing at the school? It runs for roughly 8 weeks and is \$20 per class, per student.
  - No, things like this have been run out of the school before, and it has turned into something that needs a lot of teacher and parent support to keep running. It is also complicated by not having a good stand alone multi-purpose room, so we would have to organise directly with a teacher to take over their classroom for the course. If there is a lot of people interested in this, or any other course, the school would look into doing it, but it is not something that we will be pursuing at the moment.
