HEALTH AND SAFETY INFORMATION: PUBLIC HEALTH COMMUNICABLE DISEASE GUIDANCE FOR GRADES K-12 SCHOOLS (Document is posted on our website) Vaccines

Vaccines are important tools to protect against many serious communicable diseases. Vaccination protects from serious illness due to COVID-19 and is the most effective way to reduce the impact of COVID-19 on our communities. All COVID-19 vaccines approved for use in Canada protect against serious complications, including from the omicron variant. It is important to get all recommended vaccine doses to get the most effective protection against serious cases of COVID-19. People 6 months and older are eligible for COVID-19 vaccines. More information about COVID-19 vaccines is available from the BCCDC website. Students and staff are also encouraged to ensure they are up to date on all recommended vaccines for other communicable diseases, including COVID-19 vaccines.

Health Awareness

Staff, other adults entering the school (parents, caregivers) and students are aware that they should not come to school if they are sick and unable to participate fully in routine activities.

What To Do When Sick

Staff, students, or other persons in the school setting who are exhibiting symptoms of illness, such as COVID-19 or gastrointestinal illness, should stay home until they are well enough to participate in regular activities. Staff, children, or other persons can attend school if their symptoms are consistent with a previously diagnosed health condition (e.g., seasonal allergies) or symptoms have improved enough to where you feel well enough to return to regular activities and any fever has resolved without the use of fever-reducing medication (e.g. acetaminophen, ibuprofen). The When to Get Tested for COVID-19 resource or the BC Self-Assessment Tool provides more information on whether you should get a test for COVID-19. If you are unsure or concerned about your symptoms, connect with your health care provider or call 8-1-1.

Staff, children, or other persons in the school setting who test positive for COVID-19 should follow the guidance on the BCCDC website as to how long they should self-isolate. They can return to school when they no longer need to self-isolate as long as symptoms have improved and they are well enough to participate in regular activities. Schools should **not** require a health care provider note (i.e. a doctor's note) to confirm the health status of any individual, beyond those required to support medical accommodation as per usual practice.

People with symptoms who test positive for COVID-19 should stay home until their fever has resolved and they feel well enough to participate in daily activities.

Non-medical masks and face coverings

The decision to wear a mask beyond when it is required by public health is a personal one, based on individual preference.

Respiratory Etiquette

Parents and staff can teach and reinforce good respiratory etiquette practices among students, including:

- Cough or sneeze into their elbow or a tissue. Throw away used tissues and immediately perform hand hygiene.
- Refrain from touching their eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.
- Refrain from sharing any food, drinks, unwashed utensils, cigarettes, or vaping devices.

Hand hygiene

Rigorous hand washing with plain soap and water or using an effective hand sanitizer reduces the spread of illness. Everyone should practice diligent hand hygiene and schools should facilitate regular opportunities for students and staff to wash their hands. STUDENT DROP OFF AND PICK UP

Please do not use the staff upper or lower parking lot at any time as parking is required for Eagle Ridge staff and other District staff who arrive at varying times throughout the school day. Please drop off and pick up students along Falcon, Coquitlam Crunch parking area or on neighbouring streets. The area in front of the school is for quick drop off only. Please do not park and leave your car and be aware that City Bylaw Enforcement Officers will be stepping up traffic enforcement around Coquitlam schools with random patrols.

LATE ARRIVALS AND EARLY DISMISSALS

Students arriving late or leaving early must report to the office window before attending class or departing from the school. Parents picking up early must check in at the office window and not directly to the classroom. Please do not enter the building.

DROPPING OFF STUDENT LUNCHES

We encourage parents to send their children with their lunches in the morning. On the *odd occasion* when a parent needs to drop a lunch off we ask that the lunch is in a sealed container with the student's name on it.

WESTCOAST LUNCH - We Are Going Outside to Play

Students should be prepared to be outside each day at lunch. We will only stay inside if it is raining very hard or it is extremely inclement weather. Proper boots and water-resistant jackets with hoods will help keep children warm and dry.

EXTRA CLOTHING AND INSIDE SHOES

Please send your child with a full change of clothing to be left at the school. All students should also have an inside pair of shoes to be left at school. They will be used for P.E. so please do not send slippers; running shoes are best. Please label everything with student's name or initials.

ALLERGIES - WE ARE A NUT, SCENT AND PET AWARE SCHOOL

We have a number of students who have severe allergies to various food products such as nuts and dairy. Individual classes may be sending a note home to avoid sending foods to the school that may contain these products. The oils transfer from children's hands to door handles, keyboards, iPads and other surfaces. It does become a safety issue for some and I know we all want all of our children to be safe. Please inform the office if your child has any allergies that we should be aware of.

Some staff and some students are sensitive to perfumed products. We request that you do not enter the school if you are wearing scented products. Please do not send these types of products to school with your child. This includes <u>scented</u> hand sanitizer.

STUDENT PLANNERS

Each year we ask students from grades 1-5 to purchase school planners as an organizational and communication tool between home and school. The cost for the planners is \$6.00. Planners have a handy plastic pouch that students can put all notices and loose work sheets in to take home. Please make your payment through School Cash Online (www.schoolchonline.com). Parents will be notified when School Cash Online is available.

Parents should check their child's planner on a daily basis to see what homework assignments have been given, if there are any special events coming up, or to see if the teacher has written any notes. The classroom teachers usually check the planners each morning as well.

LITTERLESS LUNCH PROGRAM

This year Eagle Ridge Elementary will continue with our efforts in going green when possible. Our goal is to reduce our ecological footprint. All students are encouraged to take home all garbage/wrappers and recyclable containers from their lunches.

BC FRUIT, VEGGIE AND MILK PROGRAM

The BC Fruit and Veggie Nutrition Program informs our students of the locally grown fruits and vegetables, importance of washing your hands and fruits and vegetables before eating and gives students the opportunity to sample the different fruits and vegetables offered with the program. Milk has also been added to the program.

INFORMATION FROM OUR SCHOOL BOARD

BC DEMOGRAPHICS SURVEY

We all deserve to live in a province where we have equitable opportunities to thrive. But many of the systems and structures our society is built on turn a blind eye to the unique needs of Indigenous Peoples and racialized people. That's why the B.C. government is running two important initiatives. They're asking everyone in B.C. to fill out the BC Demographic Survey to help identify and eliminate systemic racism from government programs and services. The survey is available online in 15 languages until Oct. 15 and will take about 15 minutes of your time. It is available at https://antiracism.gov.bc.ca/bcdemographicsurvey

The B.C. government is also asking for public input in developing anti-racism legislation that will hold government accountable for addressing systemic racism within its programs and services, and to provide supports to those who have been negatively impacted. No matter what your experiences or background is – your input matters! The public questionnaire is available until Oct. 15 in 15 languages and takes about 10 minutes to complete.
