REMINDERS

Westcoast Lunch and Recess We Are Going Outside to Play:

Students should be prepared to be outside each day at lunch and recess.

We will only stay inside if it is extremely inclement weather. Proper boots, water-resistant jackets with hoods, and optionally umbrellas will help keep children warm and dry. Please send your child with a full change of clothing to be left at school. Students should also have an inside pair of running shoes. Please dress your child appropriately for the weather conditions. We cannot call home for extra clothes.

Accessible Parking: You may know that we have 4 accessible parking spaces. Two in the staff parking lot and two in the upper school area. There are some regulations around using these spots

- Cars must clearly display their accessible parking tag on their review mirror
- Accessible tags are issued to individual people who meet the criteria. The individual associated with the tag must be in the car
- We ask that families needing the spots arrive before start and dismissal times.
- We ask that families wait until the congestion of people clears before leaving the parking spot

We have three families that use the accessible spaces daily, so we have no room in the staff parking lot for additional cars with tags. If you have an accessible tag and you have not spoken with me about where you can park, please reach out so we can look for a solution. Thank you for your cooperation!

Student Drop Off and Pick Up:

- Staff Lots Please do not use the staff upper or lower parking lot at any time as
 parking is required for Eagle Ridge staff and other District staff who arrive at varying
 times throughout the school day.
- Please drop off and pick up students along Falcon, Coquitlam Crunch parking area or on neighbouring streets.
- The area in front of the school is for quick drop off / pick up only.
 Please do not park and leave your car, as enforcement officers will ticket and fine you should they come by. Also, be aware that City Bylaw Enforcement Officers will be stepping up traffic enforcement around Coquitlam schools with random patrols.
