- Updates to AP 380 Resolution of Parent Concerns:
- Parent concerns about what happens in the classroom: plan is to meet with the teacher first, if parent is not happy with the outcome, then reach out to principal, or to the zone superintendent
- Technology update

- Every classroom will have a TV (3-4 classrooms that still had the smartboards, but they will be replaced)
- District has given an opportunity to purchase STEAM resources - $\$ 750$, available through the Learning Commons and Digital Literacy programs
- FSA evaluations for Grade 4 students Oct 2-Nov 9
- Classroom celebrations

■ Limited to Halloween, Winter Break, Valentine's Day. End of School Year

- Considerations include: affordability, sugar intake, allergies
- Parents can sign up through classroom
- Michelle Tremblay teaching situation awareness, self defense
- Working with two grades per week
- Eagle Ridge has applied for a grant, but will reach out to PAC to pay for these sessions if the grant does not come through
- Questions:
- Angela Poon: Why are planners being ordered for classrooms that are not using them?

1. Don to ask teachers about why they're not using them, needs to consult on whether parents should pay or not; will report back
2. Jenn Dearborn said planners were not a big deal in middle school and she wished she wouldn't have been so worried about it

- Erin Davis: It's been a hard day for many families considering the anti-SOGI and anti-trans protests happening in our community; wants to reiterate that this school and PAC committee should be a safe place for our kids and families.

- Had some real issues getting access to monies at the bank with Vancity

- Don Hutchinson: tried to book two new ArtStarts presentations at \$2,100, school received a grant for $\$ 4,000$

- Jenn Husband suggests asking other PACs what their experience has been with the terminal and whether it's encouraged additional purchases?
■ Andrea Hersog suggests it would be 2.5-3.5\% overall
- Joanne Breckenridge suggest it would encourage more people to donate
- Table the motion to get more information from other PACs, report back to the council for next month
■ Becky R says the Square fees are very reasonable, 2.65\% for Visa/Mastercard, flat fee for debit, fees just went up today for debit but still minimal, fees are raised if you want your money immediately, never had a problem with it not working in a school gym
- Jenn Husband offered to pull some more details and present for the next meeting
- Angela Poon asked where the money comes from in the budget
- Sarah Wells seconds
