Discussed gaming grants, we have already received ours.

#### **First Presentation- Topic Vaping**

- District is doing work with Fraser Health on vaping in 15-24 years old
- 20% of youth have vaped with nicotine 18% without nicotine
- 134 kids suspended for vaping 2018/2019 (increase from previous year)
- Doing education in the Middle and Senior Secondary schools

### Presentation on restorative practices- Restorative Justice

How schools should have restorative practices in place. A move away from punitive practices. When there are issues in school that there is a process to build relationships and not to punish.

Examples: see handout

- Bottom is where every school should be.
- School wide connecting activities
- Relationship building student to student and student to teachers
- Emotional language

Tier 2:

- When there is some trouble asking questions as opposed to accusing
- Peer Mediation

Tier 3:

• Someone may have to leave the school but helping the student to reintegrate once the issues have been resolved

This is what we try to practice at our school and it is showing on the playground. Less problems are being seen.
